EDUCATING CHILDREN – THE LEGAL CONTEXT

Be mindful of the seed you plant in your child to nurture it, if you are to achieve the desired fruits. Civil law places a responsibility upon parents to ensure their children are suitably educated; however, that does not have to take place in a school; either one maintained by the state or in a private institution. Although parents are not obliged to send their children to a school in order to comply with civil law, the vast majority do so.

This short article cannot be an exhaustive and a definitive legal guide but will describe, in general terms, the significant provisions in civil and church law that are essential to the preservation of the distinctive character and purposes of Catholic schools, enabling them to exist and function, both as part of the national educational system and as a mechanism to fulfil the mission of the Catholic Church.

The civil law comprises primary legislation (Acts of Parliament, including Charity law), regulations (known as Statutory Instruments) and guidance from the government of the day (that is, Circulars, Statutory and Non-Statutory Guidance). Under civil law the governing body carries the full duties and responsibilities of the employer and, as such, is bound by relevant employment law as well as educational law. Local Councils as arms of the government in a local area, are duty bound to provide education to the children in that locality.

The Code of Canon Law comprises the norms and regulations underpinning the structure of the Church. It describes the powers of the diocesan Bishop and other diocesan structures, but the essential purpose is to define and protect the rights of individuals, with respect to the rights of others and the Church community as a whole.

The Catholic Church requires the parents and godparents to promise the Christian upbringing of the child at baptism. This upbringing is not essentially and necessarily taking the child to a catholic school for his/her education, but it refers to the nurturing of Christian faith and Christian discipline in the child right from the day of baptism throughout life. There should be a separation between providing an education to a child to be competitive in world affairs (which catholic schools do so well) from Catholic upbringing which refers to nurturing the soul to gain eternal life. Catholic education takes a child as body and soul. They endeavour to provide the needs of each through Catholic education and upbringing.

While every parent wishes his/her child to have a good education, parents should not neglect to be mindful of the eternal salvation of their children. Where would you like your children to spend their eternity?

Live streaming of services I wish to make you aware for the second time that new guidelines have been issued to protect the privacy of individuals including children. Parents are now required to give written consent for their children to appear on camera if they want them to carry out some ministries such as reading or serving at the altar. In the Parish of Our Lady of the Engels, Nuneaton we use live streaming to enable:

- *housebound* parishioners to engage with mass from home
- *relatives/friends* who cannot attend a baptism/ wedding/ funeral to engage with it
- *the tabernacle* to be used as a focus for prayer for those who cannot get to church
- *evangelisation*: - enabling those who cannot or do not attend church for any reason to engage with acts of worship

All of these reasons are necessary in the legitimate interests of the church. The images are made available live over the internet, and can be accessed by anyone who wishes to do so. Live streaming is carried out during services and a camera focussed on the sanctuary may be live streaming all the time. there is no public access to the sanctuary area. Those who do not wish to have their image live streamed are advised to go to sit at least 6 rows from the front and to make the priest aware of that wish to receive communion out of view of the live stream. Forms are available at the back of the Church and in the Office.

Ordination of two bishops: The Cathedral will not be able to admit anyone without an invitation, and we would not want to have to turn anyone away on the day.
