#### WORLD DAY OF GRANDPARENTS AND THE ELDERLY

The Catholic Church celebrates World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly each year, on the Sunday closest to the feast of St. Joachim and St. Anne the grand parents of Jesus. Pope Francis has chosen the theme from Psalm 71:9 "Do not cast me off in my old age" to remind us that old age can be challenging indeed. It is the prayer of an elderly person. Today, loneliness of elderly people, is unfortunately a widespread reality that affects many. They tend to become victims of the throwaway culture and are considered a burden on society! Faced with this reality, families and the ecclesial community are called to be at the forefront of promoting a culture of encounter, creating space for sharing, listening, offering support and affection to the elderly people. The elderly in our society deserve our utmost respect and attention; we would not have the good things we enjoy, if it were not the people who worked so hard to make them happen. Most of us are so proud of our parents, but there might be a danger to forget that whatever qualities we admire in them, some other persons worked so hard to teach them and to pass them on to their children who, we now call our parents.

I consider myself a very lucky man to have been born and brought up in a society which has great respect for its elderly members. The older you become, the more of the centre stage you take. To be called an old person or to be given names that reflect your being old is a sign of respect and admiration other than ridicule. What kind of families would we have, and what kind of society would it be, if we did not have those men and women who have persevered in every situation, to continue living among us as our elders!

While we must admit that old age comes with its own complications, we know that it has its own joys. It is only the old person who will have had the opportunity to see his children grow up and to see his children's children. Are you elderly, be thankful that God has blessed you with long life.

I wish to ask you to bring the elderly members of your family on our Parish Family Thanksgiving Day which will take place on 1st September start at 1pm. Some of them have not been with us in social gatherings. It will be a mark of respect to be with us thanking God for his goodness to us all.

New Scam targeting pilgrims to holy places: please be on the lookout for a new scam targeting parishioners who have travelled with an independent travel company, on tours to religious sites with a religious event organiser. Fraudsters pretending to be from the travel company are writing to parishioners asking for donations. They are saying they have fallen on hard times and provide their bank account details so people can make a donation. Please do not make a donation – this is a scam. If you have made a donation, please report it to the police at Action Fraud on telephone number 0300 123 2040 or online at action-fraud.police.uk and report it to your bank. (Dial 159 to be automatically connected to your bank's fraud prevention service). If you receive any correspondence or emails from any travel company, asking for money, don't make any payments and report it to the police at Action Fraud. \* If you have been a victim of fraud or cybercrime, report it at www.actionfraud.police.uk or by calling 0300 123 2040.

Congratulations to these men the new Auxiliary Bishops, Timothy Menezes and Richard Walker, ordained on Tuesday 16 July.
