I have a fond attachment to September because 5th September is my father's birthday. Please_God_ this year_ my father, Marsiale Lwanga, will be 89 years old. As the new parish priest in this church, I have learnt that it is the month of choice for the celebrations of our annual Parish Family Day. I thank you for starting the advance preparations for it. With this message. I launch the beginning of the preparations for our parish family day and invite you to bring ideas that will make it meaningful to each parish member.
