GB haven't done so well in getting golds this week, but we've done well enough getting medals, and as always there's some amazing backstories to the athletes there. It's always nice to see people getting medals for their country who seldom ever get one. There is much to celebrate, and a lot of good going on.

There has also been a less inspiring side, with a clear anti-Christian slant.
