HAND OVER THE BATON TO SOMEONE

In the past week we laid to rest two members of our parish community Jane Goodyear and Elizabeth (Liz) Bostock. It was a painful moment to separate not only for their families but for our parish community too because these two women shared in this ministry of ours. As we took leave of our deceased sisters, I was reminded of the baptismal candle which was handed over to us on the day of baptism. Most of us were probably too young to remember, but a good number of us have seen baptisms taking place and a baptismal candle being handed over to the newly baptised baby and their families. That baptismal candle brought to me another idea of the baton rod that I saw the Olympian relay runners pass on to one another in their competition.

On the day of our baptism the baton of faith in Christ was placed in our hands. With Christ in our life, we began a race to run it steadily until the end. The 'baton' (faith) was not meant to be kept to ourselves but to pass it on to others. This is exactly what Jane Goodyear did; by word and deed, she was involved in all sorts of ministries in the parish which, as far as she was capable, was the best way for her to share her faith and to pass it on to others.

Seeing our two sisters Liz and Jane lying instate before the altar and beneath the crucifix in our church, it gave me a sense of admiration and a desire to imitate their fidelity to Christ until my last breath. At that moment there was nothing more we could ask them to do. On the other hand, from their part, you could see that there was nothing that was left in the tasks the Lord gave them to do, that they had not done.

Let us constantly think about the gift of faith that led us to the waters of baptism and what was entrusted to us when we were baptised. Conscious of being entrusted with such a great gift of faith, let us eagerly pass it on to others. All competitors at the relay race try to run as fast as they can with the baton not to keep it to themselves, but to pass it on to the other competitor. Be aware that the mistake or carelessness of one, will affect the rest in the team. In the same way all of us who believe must take our faith seriously, by living a life of integrity and hand it on to others undiluted.

I wish to thank the parishioners who formed a team with Jane Goodyear and Liz Bostock. These two parishioners have finished their race and passed the baton to us who are still on the track. I wish also to thank the ladies Vina Ross, Anne McAteer, and Jean Skidmore who spent so much time arranging flowers for Jane and Liz, without forgetting the church cleaners who made the church so clean as they normally do.
