THE REASON WHY WE WERE BAPTISED:

A life without purpose is very difficult to live. Idleness is more tiring than active life. Disciplined persons prefer having a program to follow; something to aim at, a destination in mind. Nothing can be achieved without intent. As much as opportunity offers, I like asking young people about their dreams. Most of them spontaneously say that 'they do not know,' while others begin soul-searching for the dreams they had the night before! It takes time to explain to them that by 'dream', I was referring to their purpose in life, or what they aim to achieve in life.

On Tuesday evening, we learned about the departure of Jane Goodyear to her eternal reward. As a fellow pilgrim, I felt a sense of relief, that one of us had completed the finishing line as a faithful soldier in the good fight. In the military, it is a greater honour for the soldier to die in battle than to die of malaria or diarrhoea in hospital! The soldiers celebrate rather than mourn, their fallen comrades, but they do not celebrate those who meet their death in non combative circumstances! To esteem the brevity of their fallen comrades we hear them say 'we will remember them'.

As believers in God and followers of Jesus Christ, there is no reason why we should not breath a sigh of relief and feel thankful to God when one of us departs this life as a faithful servant, and a tireless labourer in the vineyard of the Lord. Jane was that kind of person she focussed her attention on Jesus Christ and created every opportunity to instruct those who wanted to know more about him. She kept on going.

Jane has been unwell for sometime, but that did not stop her from getting involved in the activities building up the Kingdom of God through the Church. In her failing health the words of St. Paul were expressed: "neither death nor life, no angel no prince, nothing that exists, nothing still to come, not any power, or height or depth, nor any created thing, can ever come between us and the love of God made visible in Christ Jesus our Lord." Rom 8:38-39.

Our parish has of late lost members who put their faith into action such as Henry Molloy, Hugh McAteer and now Jane Goodyear among others. The offices they held voluntarily need someone to occupy them. We must carry on this ministry. As a community, we extend our condolences to Kevin Goodyear for losing such an iconic person in his life.

Message from the Diocesan Safeguarding Team: some of you have asked me why our many of our Altar Servers are not serving these days I have been asked to share the following message from the diocesan Safeguarding Team: "any Altar Servers over the age of 18 need a DBS check. We understand where young people may have served for many years, that this can get overlooked once they reach 18, but they do need a DBS. If altar servers who have reached 18 haven't recently done so, please could we ask that you work with your Parish Safeguarding Rep, or review your own list of altar servers, and check that any who have now reached 18 in the last year or so, have undergone the full "safer recruitment" process and have appropriate checks. Any questions, please speak to the Safeguarding Admin Team." All our altar servers have submitted their documentation for a DBS and the process is being handled. I pray that this is done quickly so that we may serve the mystery of our faith together.
