THIS WREATH WILL WITHER AWAY

The Olympic games have again showed us how body training, mental resilience and physical endurance can make people to perform tasks that fascinate our minds. How could anyone perform that, we wonder! I notice that almost all the competitors are young people most of who started their training at a very young age. They were certainly supported by their families and schools. In their physical endurance, they carry our nation's hopes, and in their success they bring us joy irrespective of who we are, or which creed we profess. They become our national heroes.

The presence of young people on our national television screens which makes our hearts cheerful tells us, that the youth are a powerful force in the world, that cannot be dismissed as ineffective. Some people with bad motives know what a powerful force young people are, that unfortunately they manipulate them to their own advantage such as engaging them in criminal activities. They take them away from God, from the Church and from any form of living that upholds "everything that is true, everything that is noble, everything that is good and pure, everything that we love and honour and everything that can be thought virtuous or worthy of praise" (Phil 48). This negative approach is directed especially to families with children. There tends to be a shift from traditional family value of raising them up with respect for their elders and in practice of faith values upheld by the family, and put emphasis on children to create their own values and to make their own choices especially in matters of religious upbringing. Any form of mentoring along these lines is likely to be interpreted as an attempt to interfere in the child's freedom to choose.

The Olympic games paint a different picture. Many competitors come from families where sport is esteemed. Future Olympians used to see their parents either playing games or cheering their best sportsmen. Once they became of age it became almost natural to them to pursue sports. The families supported them, schools trained them.

As Christians it is important to start mentoring our children in faith from the very start, if they are to appreciate the faith that we uphold. Why should you excuse or dispense yourself from bringing up the child in the faith, when you do not dispense yourself offering an education to him/her until he or she chooses it or not! We know how to mentor children in worldly choices, why should we fall short of mentoring them in values that are eternal as Christ teaches us!

The Olympians in France are fighting for a wreath that will wither away, but in Christ we are fighting for a wreath that will never wither (1Cor. 9:25). Let us mentor each other and young people in particular to fight for this wreath,
