"IT IS RIGHT AND JUST:"

Our parish Deacon Michael Skidmore, might not believe this, but the most emphatic statement he makes during Holy Mass is "*It is Right and Just*" These words come as a spontaneous response to the priest when he leads the people of God in prayer shortly before the prayer of Consecration at Mass. The Priest says:

The Lord be with you: R/ *And with your spirit*

Lift up your hearts: R/ *We have raised them to the Lord*

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God R/ *It is right and just.*

Deacon Michael stands a short distance away from the priest at the altar. He comes out so well to say that *It is right and just* a statement which summarises why our Sunday assembly, shows our collective confession that what we are doing is indeed God's due. It is indeed *right and just* that we assemble as a community of believers in our town to celebrate our Sunday Mass. Therefore, when Deacon Michael emphatically says those words, they carry the weight of why we assemble on this consecrated ground.

This coming Sunday we shall celebrate our family thanksgiving day. Possibly it is the first time that we are doing this together. This is not a harvest festival, it is not an event for a selected few, or for those who have nothing to do at home, instead it is a time to say "God thank you for your goodness to me and for everything that goes on in my life and in my family. Yes, every person has something to thank God for.

When Our Lord wanted to give thanks to His heavenly Father for the mission he had given to him, which was soon coming to an end through his crucifixion and death, he shared a meal with his disciples. We call it the Last Supper. That meal united the disciples, they recognised their identity and their mission.

It is right and just that we show our thanksgiving by preparing some food and have our fellow Christians eat it. *It is right and just* that from the many gifts God has given us, we can share with others. *It is right and just* to spend some time together because we are fellow workers in the vineyard of the Lord building up his kingdom.

The vulnerable members of our parish will be our guests. Food and drink will be served to them in the lounge. With these thoughts in mind, I immediately understand why Deacon Michael emphatically makes this acclamation "*it is right and just*".

An exhibition of the Shroud of Turin comes to St. Patrick's Church 1st – 15th September 2024. An exhibition around one of the most famous religious artefacts in history is coming to St Patrick's, Deedmore Road, Coventry CV2 2HW. Visitors will be able to see a full-sized replica of the Shroud of Turin as part of a fascinating exhibition which will be on display from 1st to 15th September. The Shroud is a length of linen cloth that bears a faint image of the front and back of a crucified man. Many believe it is the actual burial shroud used to wrap the body of Jesus of Nazareth after his crucifixion, and upon which his bodily image is miraculously imprinted. The exhibition will also feature other displays and detailed information, which cover evidence revealed by historical and scientific research, explaining how the Shroud's image and bloodstains align with Gospel accounts. The exhibition will be open Tuesdays to Fridays 5 - 7pm, Saturdays 12 -4 pm. Sundays after Mass (about 11.30) 1pm.

Training in the New Lectionary: Rev. Fr Allen Morris, former Secretary to the Bishops' Conference and former Secretary to the Bishops' Conference Department for Christian Life and Worship, will visit St Mary and St Benedict Church, 52a, Raglan Street Coventry, CV1 5QF on Sunday, 29th September to facilitate the training, lectors starting at 3pm. This is a unique opportunity for all ministers of the Word - clergy and lay - to take part and refresh their appreciation of the Word entrusted to them. It will be very good if as many Lectors as possible could go to attend this training.
