Lord, give us that bread always.

This brief invocation in John 6:34 is the spontaneous response of the people to Jesus after he told them that the Father gives them the bread from heaven which gives life to the world (Jn, 6:34-35). The invocation, 'Lord, give us that bread always' is closely similar to the fourth petition, 'give us today our daily bread' in the Lord's prayer, (Mt. 6:9-13).

We need to pose in silence and delve in the deep meaning of the people's petition, 'give us that bread always' (John) as we ask the Lord for the daily bread. Do we know what we are asking for when we mention that petition?

What we ask for in the daily bread, is real food to sustain our bodily life, just as Jesus fed the crowds who flocked to him because they needed to eat. We note however, that in John's narrative, Jesus introduces the bread that gives life to the world. This points to a spiritual bread that humans need for the salvation of their souls. It is a petition for everything that takes care of our entire human flourishing that includes the bodily and spiritual lives.

The petition is an invitation for self-consciousness and an awareness of our deep human longing for a happy life. It is also an opportunity to deeply trust and accept God's ways because they guide our paths to full human contentment that extends beyond earthly life.

When our Lord says that he is the living bread, he is presenting himself as the one we need to save us. To us he is the bread because he is the way, the truth and life. He is the one we need to satisfy all our personal hunger and thirst. In the same invocation, we ask for all that sustains our salvation, the outpouring of the Holy Spirit with his many gifts of wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety and the fear of God (Catechism of the Catholic Church, No. 1831).

Jesus, as living bread, is the Word of God that satisfies our curiosity for the truth that saves, and the answer to all our questions and quests. To gain fully from what he offers we must believe and fully surrender to him, for he says, 'he who believes in me will never thirst' (Jn. 6:35).
