EAT THE BREAD OF LIFE

The Word of God is ever old and yet ever new. In 1 Kings 19:4-8 we encounter Elijah, running away from Queen Jezebel who sought to kill him. He takes a long journey to seek refuge at Mount Horeb, the mountain of God. Because he ran out of energy due to exhaustion, he slept and prayed that he should die! God, who wanted to save him, sent an angel to give him the food he needed for his long journey; after eating, he walked for 40 days and arrived at the mountain of God, Mount Horeb (1Kgs 19:8). This is exactly what God does for all who believe in him.

The journey of our Christian life is much longer than Elijah's, it is longer than any earthly journey imaginable in the material universe. This is because it is spiritual by nature, and for it, God provides Jesus as the bread of life: the bread for our spiritual nourishment.

Jesus told his listeners exactly what his Father was doing among them. He said, 'It was not Moses who gave you bread from heaven, it is my Father who gives you the bread from heaven' (John 6:32). Again, he told them, 'Your fathers ate the manna in the desert, and they are dead; but this is the bread that comes down from heaven, so that a man may eat it and not die' (John 6:49-50)

The invitation that he gave to his listeners and to all past generations, he gives the same to us now, namely, that they should believe in him as the 'bread of life that has come down from heaven so that a man may eat it and not die.' (John 6:50) To eat the bread of life means to believe in Jesus as the Son of the living God who leads us to eternal life; it is to listen and obey his voice as the Good Shepherd, and to incorporate him in our journey of life so that he enriches it with fresh meaning. To eat the living bread, is to trust and follow Jesus who is the Way, the Truth and the Life (John 14:6).

We thank God for the gift of our faith that enables us to recognise Jesus as our bread of life; we encounter him in the Eucharistic celebration (Holy Mass) to which we bring all that we are. Here, we listen to his Word and receive him in the Sacrament of the Eucharist.
