THE MONTH OF AUGUST Since the 16th century Catholic piety has assigned entire months to special devotions. The month of August is traditionally dedicated to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. The physical heart of Mary is venerated (and not adored as the Sacred Heart of Jesus is) because it is united to her person and is the seat of her love virtue, and inner life. Christ's Heart flows with the Blood which He assumed from his mother. Mary gave her blood to Him. He gives His Blood, her blood, to us. Focus on Mary's Immaculate Heart rose in stages during the Middle Ages with Ss Anselm and Bernard, and through the 17th and 18th centuries and the efforts of saints such as Ss Francis de Sales and John Eudes. The 1830 apparition of Our Lady to St Catherine Labouré in Paris, which led to the creation of the Miraculous Medal, helped to spread the devotion. This devotion has received new emphasis from the visions given to Lucy Dos Santos, oldest of the visionaries of Fatima, in her convent in Tuy, in Spain, in 1925 and 1926. In the visions Our Lady asked for the practice of the Five First Saturdays to help make amends for the offenses committed against her heart by the blasphemies and ingratitude of men. The practice parallels the devotion of the Nine First Fridays in honour of the Sacred Heart. On October 31st 1942, Pope Pius XII made a solemn Act of Consecration of the Church and the whole world to the Immaculate Heart. During August we have lovely feasts in honour of Our Lady including Our Lady of the Snows on August 5th, the Assumption on the 15th and on 22nd August the Queenship of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

ASSUMPTION OF OUR BLESSED LADY is celebrated on Friday 15th August and is a Holy Day of Obligation for us as Catholics, therefore our duty to attend Mass. Masses at STM will be at 6.45am, 10.00am and 7.00pm; and Mass at SJW will be at 12noon.

Although this Solemnity marks the end of Our Lady's life on earth it is nevertheless a day of rejoicing – for it marks her entrance fully into the life of God when she received the reward of her absolute faithfulness and trust in God her saviour. Whilst in this world she was limited in her motherly care to the early church gathered around the apostles, now, from her place in heaven, she intercedes for the whole Church, in all time. She is our mother too, so let us come on this day to ask her prayers, so that the glory she now enjoys may, one day, be ours.

He spent the next seven years based at Aston Hall in Staffordshire, from where he celebrated Mass, preached Missions, heard confessions, and received many people into the Catholic Church, the most famous being St John Henry Newman in October 1845. Blessed Dominic had a well-known reputation for sanctity and holiness of life. He is also remembered for his love for the poor, and those in need of prayer and help.
