Our readings remind us of God's care, our call to live with kindness, and the importance of faith in Jesus. In the First Reading, Elijah is overwhelmed and seeks death in the wilderness. He feels alone and tired, but God sends an angel to give him food and water. This shows that God does not abandon us, even in our lowest moments. He sees our struggles and offers help. Elijah's journey to Horeb becomes possible because of God's care. We learn that God sustains us in difficult times. Like Elijah, we need to trust that God will provide what we need. His support helps us continue our journey.

St Paul tells us to avoid behaviours that grieve the Holy Spirit. We are called to be kind, compassionate, and forgiving. This is how we should live as followers of Christ. His message is simple: treat others with love and respect. Holding on to anger and bitterness hurts us and those around us. By forgiving and showing kindness, we live like Jesus

In the Gospel, Jesus declares that He is the living bread from heaven. This bread gives eternal life to those who believe in Him. The Jews struggle to understand this message. Jesus emphasises that only those drawn by the Father can come to Him. This passage highlights the importance of faith in Jesus. By believing in Him, we receive the gift of eternal life. Jesus invites us to trust in Him and receive His life-giving presence.

Lord, thank you for your constant care and support. Help us to live with kindness and forgive others as you forgive us. Strengthen our faith in Jesus, the bread of life. Amen.

NOVENA TO BLESSED DOMINIC BARBERI begins on Sunday 18th and ends on 26th August, his Feast Day. Blessed Dominic arrived in the Archdiocese in February 1842. He spent the next seven years based at Aston Hall in Staffordshire, from where he celebrated Mass, preached Missions, heard confessions, and received many people into the Catholic Church, the most famous being St John Henry Newman in October 1845. Blessed Dominic had a well-known reputation for sanctity and holiness of life. He is also remembered for his love for the poor, and those in need of prayer and help. Novena prayer cards will be available at the back of both STM and SJW.
