Our readings remind us of the importance of choosing to follow God, living in loving unity, and facing the challenges of discipleship. They remind us of the importance of faith, commitment, and love in our lives. Let us reflect on these lessons and strive to live them out daily.

In the First Reading, Joshua challenges the Israelites to choose whom they will serve. This decision is crucial for their identity and future. Joshua reminds them of God's faithfulness and the many ways He has delivered them. We too, face choices about our allegiance. We can choose to follow God or be swayed by other influences. Our commitment to God shapes our lives and our actions. Choosing God means putting Him first in everything. It means trusting His guidance and following His commandments. This choice is a daily decision, and it requires faith and dedication.

In the Gospel, Jesus talks about the difficulty of His teachings. Many of His disciples find His words hard to accept and leave Him. Peter, however, reaffirms his faith in Jesus. Following Jesus is not always easy. It requires accepting difficult truths and making sacrifices. Some may find this too challenging and turn away. Peter's confession shows true discipleship. He recognises Jesus as the Holy One of God and chooses to stay. This teaches us the importance of faith and commitment, even when the path is hard.

Lord, help us to choose You every day. Strengthen our commitment to follow Your ways. Fill our hearts with love and guide us through the challenges we face. Amen.

**`SEEKING THE LIGHT'** is an exhibition of textile art by Alexandra Kingswell, which takes its inspiration from the Bible and Christian spirituality. The exhibition will be held in Coventry Cathedral from  $1^{st} - 31^{st}$  August. Admission free.

**AN EXHIBITION OF THE SHROUD OF TURIN** is coming to St Patrick's, Deedmore Road, Coventry, CV2 2HW. Visitors will be able to see a full-sized replica of the Shroud of Turin as part of a fascinating exhibition which will be on display from  $1^{st} - 15^{th}$ September. The Shroud is a linen cloth that bears a faint image of the front and back of a crucified man. Many believe it is the burial shroud used to wrap the body of Jesus after his crucifixion, and upon which his bodily image is miraculously imprinted. The exhibition will also feature other displays and detailed information boards, which cover evidence revealed by historical and scientific research, explaining how the Shroud's image and bloodstains align with Gospel accounts. The exhibition will be open on Tuesdays to Fridays 5.00pm – 7.00pm, Saturdays from 12noon – 4.00pm and after Sunday Mass, from about 11.30pm – 1.00pm.
