He took him away from the crowd, and said, 'Be opened.' And his ears were opened and the ligament of his tongue loosened, and he spoke clearly.

Healing is such an important part of Jesus' ministry - it announces that the Good News is here, that the time of our salvation is at hand. Not surprisingly, people flocked from all over to be healed by Jesus. But Jesus isn't interested in the sensational, in the celebrity status it might bring. So, in today's Gospel, he wants to help the deaf man, but he doesn't want to play the crowd's game of bringing someone to him so that they can see something dramatic.

So, Jesus takes the man off in private, communicates with him, and heals him. It is a healing moment, but it is a personal healing moment that opens up relationship with Jesus for the man. Being able to speak and hear are important, but the inner healing even more so. From this we can learn to look for Jesus and his healing in the personal, the inner life we have. We can also learn from him to strive to make all the good we do be focused on the other person, not on ourselves or the dramatic.

We've finally got the outside lights at Corpus Christi fixed as well: it took a long time for us to find the fault - the floodlight and box on the porch roof. We've also got National Grid coming in on Friday to repair the main fuse box.

PARISH COUNCIL Thanks for agreeing to come on our day retreat to Mount St Bernard, on Sat 21st September. We'll start with 9.30am Mass and adoration at St Anne's, then head off, then return for 4.30pm. I've emailed you a rough timetable, but there are some hard copies in the porch too. EUCHARISTIC MINISTERS I shared with you recently that I think it's time we returned to receiving Communion under both kinds - host and from the chalice. I didn't have a massive response, but those that did agreed. For this to happen, we will need generosity from all, and more Eucharistic ministers. Some of you have agreed to be ministers and given me your name and contact details: thank you. Two of you have agreed, but then not sent me your details. And we still need a few more. AN EXHIBITION OF THE TURIN SHROUD AT ST PATRICK'S: 1ST-15TH SEPTEMBER, 2024

An exhibition around one of the most famous religious artefacts in history is coming to St Patrick's, Deedmore Road, Coventry CV2 2HW. Visitors will be able to see a full-sized replica of the Shroud of Turin as part of a fascinating exhibition which will be on display in our church from 1st to 15th September. The Shroud is a length of linen cloth that bears a faint image of the front and back of a crucified man. Many believe it is the actual burial shroud used to wrap the body of Jesus of Nazareth after his crucifixion, and upon which his bodily image is miraculously imprinted. The exhibition will also feature other displays and detailed information boards, which cover evidence revealed by historical and scientific research, explaining how the Shroud's image and bloodstains align with Gospel accounts. The exhibition will be open Tuesdays to Fridays 5 - 7pm, Saturdays 12-4pm, Sundays 11.30am-1pm. All welcome.
