Today we have a pastoral letter from Archbishop Bernard. It flows from last week being Home Mission Sunday when we were reminded that all of us are called to go and make disciples. This has two dimensions: witnessing to Christ through speaking truth and proclaiming the Gospel; and witnessing to him through reaching out to others, especially the most vulnerable.

As they say, no good deed goes unpunished, and the readings today remind us that, as if preaching the Gospel or helping others isn't hard enough in itself, we will also get in trouble for it. The godless will become angry with us and plot against us - casting false allegations against us. We will be attacked, and often even the people we seek to help will be anything but appreciative. But, to be fair, that puts us in good company, because that's what happened to Jesus, and more. So, let the missionary calling in your heart be re-activated, and let us all, as the body of Christ, re-commit to making disciples and to helping the most vulnerable.

Dear Parishioners,

There was a good response to our time of adoration last Sunday, as part of our Nation's Eucharistic Congress. I'd say 35 people attended, which is still only 10% of the parish, but was still good. Thank you. And there were people from both churches, continuing to win the battle over the last few who still think in terms of us and them.

Your prayers for the centre and convent had a fairly immediate impact too. I won't say too much yet, but I think we're in a much better position now. Please keep up the prayers, that this may continue! If the devil doesn't like what we are doing, then it's a sure sign that we're on the right path.

Over these weeks we are being encouraged to renew our missionary commitment - to preach the Gospel and to bring healing to those in need: the two aspects of Jesus' ministry, before his death. We are each called to do this, but even more importantly, we are called to do them together, each playing our part.

I owe you two apologies. Twice I've asked for volunteers. Twice got a good response. And twice didn't make the most of it. The first time was a year ago, when many of you filled out volunteer forms. Lots was done in response, and many houses blessed, but lots was left unfulfilled. Sorry. And then, in July, Deacon Keith spoke to those of you at Corpus Christi and 57 people volunteered to help with the centre, and for one reason and another, that didn't quite work. So please forgive me. Third time lucky! I'm going to give you all a volunteer form in the next week or two. As well as the familiar ways we can help the parish, there will also be opportunities to help with the centre next year - and I hope people from both churches will continue to be involved. The clearest needs we have are volunteers to help run the café - fairly simple and training will be given, but it's not rocket science; people helping ring the housebound, with Linkline - not so simple, but we will definitely give you all the help you need; and cleaning the hall - no training required, I'm guessing.

You do not need to ask yourself are you called to be missionary - you are. The questions we all have to ask is in which way am I called to be missionary, and should that include an extra step at the moment. And the answer to that is found in time in prayer, ideally before the Blessed Sacrament, and in submission to God daily: I trust in your power, I trust in your wisdom, I trust in your love, and I offer myself to you. let's all try it and see where the Spirit leads us.

The Parish Council are leading the way in this. Our retreat day, Saturday, was an opportunity for us to come before the Lord, in prayer and submission, and discuss together our way forward. A great day.

EUCHARISTIC MINISTERS Another ministry is being a Eucharistic Minister. We are hoping to return to receiving Holy Communion under both kinds - Body and Blood. For this to happen, we will need generosity from all, and more Eucharistic ministers. Have a think: who could you recommend to be a minister?
