'Anyone who is not against us is for us.'

Today's Gospel quote is similar to last week's - 'anyone who is not against us is for us'. They both stem from Jesus, and his Father's, desire for us all to be united in love as one family. In our guiding others we should always be looking to want to say yes, we should always be looking at the positive first. This doesn't mean that we never say no; it doesn't mean we don't deal with the negative. Both of these are important. But it does mean that we are all encouraging. And that's what we all need. If we are going to take a little step outside our comfort zone, we tend to need encouragement. And that's definitely true when it comes to the parish. It can be really daunting for someone to try something new - for all sorts of reasons. But if we can help each other get over that first hurdle, the blessings for us all can be huge. Think of our Masses of Many Tongues, our Corpus Christi processions, our Marian processions and other times when we've been encouraged and responded positively - great experiences followed, often bringing healing and joy. Jesus calls us to give it a go. To get out of the boat. He'll catch you, if you start sinking. The man was casting out devils in Jesus' name: we're just being asked to volunteer a bit!

Today, as you can see, you have a **volunteer form** attached to your newsletter! There are pens at the back of church if you want to fill it in before you go. Or take it with you, have a pray and a ponder, fill it in, and then bring it back next week. But please do fill it in. We are one body - the Body of Christ - and a body is only healthy when all its parts, all its organs work, and work together. We can get round that without anyone feeling stupid or inadequate - because none of us are.

Let's make this parish truly one body, one family, where we give God praise, help each other and reach out to others - each playing our small part.
