THE CONNECTION IS VERY REMOTE

I have been impressed by the number of woodpigeons busily feeding their young. If you are a small vegetable gardener like Roger in the parish allotment, woodpigeons are by no means friendly. The devotion of animals, birds and insects to take care of their young, is a lesson to human beings, how God has created man with superior wisdom to aspire for eternal values. It has been so good to see children back in school. Let us support them and the teachers to achieve excellence.

Catholic schools have governing bodies to assist the Church in maintaining Catholic ethos. Acting together, all the governors have a duty under civil law to conduct them with a view to promoting high standards of academic achievement. In doing so, they must comply with the school's Instrument of Government, and Trust Deed. Each of these documents will contain a clause defining the school's Catholic ethos, character and purpose.

Foundation Governors are appointed by the Bishop, they have additional duties and responsibilities to secure the Catholic character of the school and to ensure it is run in accordance with the Trust Deed.

The governing body of a Catholic school must use its legal powers to ensure its employment policies are consistent with the school's fundamental purpose. It must abide with directions from the school's trustees, so fulfilling its statutory duty to maintain and develop the religious character of the school.

Overall some 46% of teachers working Catholic schools ought to be baptised Catholics. The employment contacts given by governing bodies to all teaching staff will include a clause emphasising the religious character of the school and the corresponding duties of the employees. That clause will be worded along the following lines or something very similar:

"... The teacher hereby agrees: ... to have regard to the Roman Catholic character of the School and not do anything in any way detrimental or prejudicial to the interests of the same;"

You need not be a Catholic to secure a place for your child in a Catholic School. Some people finding out that there are requirements including to produce a baptismal certificate, they get tempted to ask for baptism, not because they are want to become Catholics but because they want a place for their child in a Catholic school. The connection between the two is very remote.

If you want to have your child baptised, you need to know that at least one parent must be baptised Catholic, a child must have at least one baptised Catholic for a godparent. Parents who want a godparent who is baptised in another denomination (faith), they will not be listed as a godparent but as a witness. The minister will need to see proof of baptism. You should contact the church at which you were baptised for a copy of your baptismal certificate. You must reside within the parish boundaries and to attend Mass weekly. Do not seek baptism for your child because you want to secure a place in a catholic school. The connection is very remote indeed.
