Celebrating Education Sunday, 8 September: An opportunity to celebrate and give thanks to all involved in making Catholic schools and universities places of enlightenment. Education Sunday on 8th Sept. and beginning of the new academic year starts and is one of the oldest Days of Special Prayer in England and Wales, established 176 years ago in 1848. The year 6 pupils from our parish schools Good Shepherd and St Elizabeth's, will be enrolled to the sacramental programme of Confirmation. They will begin their preparation for the reception of the Sacrament of Confirmation during this Mass.

Fr Moses will be celebrating his Silver Jubilee, the 25th Anniversary of Priestly Ordination in October this year 2024. To celebrate this occasion with him, We, the Zimbabwe Catholic community chaplaincy based at St Elizabeth's parish, would like to take a lead to raise funds in support of Fr Moses chosen Charity which is an orphanage. We are starting this fundraising from Saturday 7 September 2024 with BBQ in the Parish Garden from 1pm. Money raised will be in aid of the orphans & refugees' children who have been supported by Fr Moses and are now settled in Pabbo-Uganda, about 23 Miles from Uganda - South Sudan border of Nimule. 22nd Sunday Year B

Readings: Dt. 4:1-2,6-8; Ps. 14; James. 1:17-18,21-22,27; Mark 7:1-8,14-15,21-23 Practicing True Religion.

It is back to school time and the store shelves are brimming with fresh new school supplies. Bright coloured pens and pencils and erasers, notebooks, computers and folders, new lunch boxes and backpacks, shoes and cloths. These supplies signal a new beginning.

You and I are now back to the school after the six weeks of meditations on *Bread of Life*. What is my shopping list? What do I need most to succeed at God's school? Today's readings are about law and love and how they can help us to practice the true religion. Many years ago, a youth group had a meeting. The structure of the meeting was a talk, followed by a sharing among the teens. The topic that week was parents. After the talk about the Fourth Commandment, the teen sharing started. Each teen talked about how unfair his or her parents were. "My girlfriend and I were studying for this test, and I got home fifteen minutes late, beyond my curfew. Now I can't go to the football game this Friday." etc. Then Margret spoke, "I don't have any curfew. I can come home anytime I want, even on school nights. I have no rules." Then she looked at everyone and burst into tears saying, "Why don't my parents love me?" For Margret, laws, or even rules for daily living in the home, showed they were loved. This is how the ancient Hebrews viewed the Law of God. It showed God's love for them.

Today's first reading embodies this. But as time went on, the people began to forget why they had the Law. And the regulations began to take a life of their own. This is exactly what Jesus is addressing in today's Gospel. The Pharisees complained that Jesus's disciples did not follow all of the legal customs of the Hebrew people. Jesus tells them that they are more concerned with human traditions than what is at the heart of God's commandments-LOVE. The school of Love is a life-long education. Our graduation is when we enter into heaven singing the song Marching united in Christ ,marching united to heaven" It is easier to follow external rules and rituals than to convert our hearts and our lifestyles to following Jesus Christ. In the Deuteronomy, Moses urges the Israelites to carefully observe the commandments of the Lord. The commandments are a clear guide for our actions. In the second reading ,James tells us to Be doers of the word and not hearers only, deceiving ourselves. In the Gospel Jesus calls out the hypocrisy of the Pharisees through Isaiah's prophesy. This people honours me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me. Jesus shares a list of sins which come from within including evil thoughts, greed, envy and deceit.

Today's psalm invites us to live an active faith that does justice: Whoever walks blamelessly and does justice; 'Who thinks the truth in his heart and slanders not with his tongue. Who harms not his fellow man, One who does justice, will live in the presence of the Lord'. Like the people mentioned in today's gospel, we know that it is much easier to deal with outer, visible things than with our interior life. That is what Pope Francis is reminding us and teaching us to fallow our hearts and to be led by the Spirit of love. And so, like the people of Jesus' time, we tend to evaluate ourselves and others in purely external ways: Such as:-the number of prayers we recite, the amount of money we give, etc. There is nothing wrong with external things, but there is also an inner world that shapes and gives meaning to the external. It is difficult to retain a clear vision of the Gospel: that "God is Spirit, and those who worship him should worship in spirit and in truth (John 4:24). The spirit of faith is hard to keep in sight at all times, yet it is meant for all times. We are forever in danger of stepping into the shoes of the Pharisees. However, Jesus loves us the way we are and calls us to repentance.

What the Pharisees lacked in spectacular fashion was any kind of interiority or depth; their minds were turned outwards, to rules and vindication. What matters, Jesus said, is not what goes into a person from the outside, but what comes out from the inside. Religion is not about things, it is about us! It is about the kind of response we make to the world, to others, and to God.
