

Exhibition of the Shroud of Turin at St Patrick's:1st -

15th September 2024 An exhibition around one of the most famous religious artefacts in history is coming to St Patrick's, Deedmore Road, Coventry CV2 2HW. Visitors will be able to see a full-sized replica of the Shroud of Turin as part of a fascinating exhibition. The Shroud is a length of linen cloth that bears a faint image of the front and back of a crucified man. Many believe it is the actual burial shroud used to wrap the body of Jesus of Nazareth after his crucifixion, and upon which his bodily image is miraculously imprinted. The exhibition will also feature other displays and detailed information boards, which cover evidence revealed by historical and scientific research, explaining how the Shroud's image and bloodstains align with Gospel accounts. The exhibition will be open - Tuesdays to Fridays 5 - 7pm,Saturdays 12 -4 pm& Sundays after Mass (about 11.30) 1pm .

## 23rd Sunday Year B

Readings: Isaiah . 35:4-7; Ps. 145; James. 2:1-5; Mark 7:31-37

#### God of the Oppressed.

The Greek Philosopher (Cicero) said that a 'tear dries quickly especially when it is shed for the misfortunes of others.' He was talking about compassion. Compassion is the root of religion as pride is the root of sin. We may dismiss compassion from our heart, but God never will. In fact, the compassion we see in the kind-hearted is God's own compassion. He has given it to us to protect the oppressed for he himself is the God of the oppressed. Addressing his chosen people who were suffering from their exile, he said: "Fear not; your Saviour will come; at his coming, the eyes of the blind will be opened, the ears of the deaf will be cleansed, and the lame will leap like a tag" (Is. 35:4).

Our Saviour, Jesus Christ did come. He showed great concern for all those oppressed by poverty, infirmity, sickness, injustice, discrimination and many other kinds of hardships. Anyone who observed Christ relieving people from their miseries could easily affirm that "God chose those who are poor in the eyes of the world" (Jas 2:5). God loves and cares for all of us. But when Jesus made the blind see, the deaf hear, the crippled walk (Mk 7:35), we have a window into the heart of God, a heart that beats faster at the sight of the oppressed. The cries of the oppressed have not yet ceased even after the coming of the Saviour into our world. Millions are oppressed by injustices of others, the injustices that result from an increase of selfishness and exaggerated nationalism, the injustice that results from a propensity to dominate others beyond the limits of one's legitimate rights and merits, and from a propensity to exploit the whole material progress and the technology of production for the exclusive purpose of dominating others.

Many, in most societies, are oppressed by discrimination and discrimination is a way of acting that affects minority people's lives and life chances. People suffer from prejudices of others, and prejudice is having a negative attitude towards group of people based on false assumptions. Still others suffer from racism and racism is the belief that certain 'races' are superior to others. We sometimes call such sufferers as the 'handicapped' and, in doing so, we indicate how little we expect from them and how little they expect from us. In the face of such an appalling spectacle of the oppressed, underprivileged and disadvantaged, how can we remain silent and indifferent? If the rejection of others is not my sorrow too, if the anguish of my neighbour in all its forms touches me not, if the lack of hope of my brothers and sisters does not torment me, how can I call myself the child of God who is the Lord of the oppressed?

We can't close our eyes in blindness to the hunger of people around the plight of victims struck by artificial disasters and the injustices done to immigrants and refugees. We can't turn a deaf ear to the cries of frustration from people victimised because of their colour, to the cries of loneliness from the so called 'untouchable', or to the cries of hurt from people we have injured by our own acts of violence to human rights and dignity. We can't keep our tongue silent when we should speak boldly in defence of the discriminated, of fairness of sharing the goods of the world with the poor.

Therefore, our lord asks us for a change of heart towards the oppressed. On our own, no real change is possible, but if we allow the Lord to touch us, even hearts of stone will melt into heart of flesh. By his touch, he can open our eyes, unplug our ears and loosen our tongues. When the Lord touches us, not only we are changed but we in turn are enabled to touch others and lift them from their miseries. When the Lord work through us, the hatred which divides person to person will end, man's indifference to the plight of the marginalised will ends, the greed which urges so many to keep all they have and not share with their neighbour will end; above all, the pride which leads to trust in ourselves and not in God will end.
