Update - New Parish Hall!

The parish Finance and New Hall committees have agreed to move forward with integra as our constructor and to build for us the new hall according to the revised design (see a copy of design on the notice board). The design includes among other things - emergency exit door in hall has changed to 2035x2100mm fully glazed double door. HL window on hall gable wall has changed to 1800x2100mm double fixed window. HL window to the left of the main entrance doors has changed to a 1800x2100mm double fixed window. Single external door in lobby area removed. Cleaners' cupboard relocated and put together with store, Urinary created opposite store, three WC's same place plus disable WC. Breakout room next to welcome area—this room will be plastering skim finish. 900x1800mm single TOV window added to offer natural light and ventilation. Internal door to store changed to a single door. Addition of a wall mounted air con unit to the newly formed breakout room A Brick wall or something similar will be constructed in a welcome area to reflect the names of those who sponsored a brick. There will be final detailed drawings for electric sockets etc., but for now this is just about agreeing the layout. Please continue to pray that this project is a success.

Pabbo Children's Home Water Project.

Thank you for all the support to this Water Project for the children in need of lifesaving water at their St Josephine Bakhita Children's Home. Last Sunday Janet and Kevin organised a Fundraising concert in their village and raised £650. Another £1000 was also donated by a friend of St Elizabeth's and other donations too from parishioners. Total of £2950 has been raised. Quotations for a Borehole in US Dollars is \$6,262, and for Solar water pump in US Dollars is \$12,959. 26th Sunday Year B

Readings: Numbers 11:25-29; Ps. 18; James 5:1-6; Mark 9:38-43, 45, 47-48

Let the Flower Flourish.

Mahatma Gandhi. Where is he now, in heaven, or in hell, or at least in purgatory? He was not a Catholic and Catholics until a few decades ago believed that outside the Catholic Church there is everything except salvation. He was not a Christian: from the day he was refused admission to worship in a Christian church in South Africa, just because he was coloured, he turned his back on Christianity. But even as a Hindu he believed in the unique power of Christ's teachings so much that he said to Winston Churchill that the only way for world peace is that all nations abide by the Beatitudes.

He even practiced one of the hardest sayings of Christ: "Love your enemies." Can this man, just because he did not belong to the visible group of Christ's followers, be separated from God? I hope not.

It is not patriotism, but it is based on the reply Jesus gave to his disciples who complained that some people not belonging to their circle were working miracles. Jesus asked them not to stop the good others were doing, for "anyone who is not against us is with us" (Mk 9:40). What did he mean? He meant that anyone who is attached to God and struggles against the self-centred forces of evil is on the side of Christ, that one does not necessarily have to be part of the visible group following Christ in order to partake of the power of God and that it is wrong to assume that only those who have consciously accepted Christ as personal saviour will be saved and will be able to do the works of God. Thus, Jesus broke through the exclusiveness of all those small groups of believers who think that they have exclusive rights, special access to the full truth. How often we get so wrapped up in our own sect/church that it leads to the building of barriers rather than bridges between us and the people of other religions and denominations! We sometimes become jealous of the achievements of other religious groups, like the disciples of Moses. When they complained out of jealousy that Eldad and Medad who were not of their circle were also prophesying, Moses rebuked them for their envy which at times can be as cruel as grave, asked them to let the flower flourish where it will, and only wished, ".... that the Lord might bestow his spirit on them all! (Numb 11:29). Hence, Catholics, Protestants and non-Christians are not against one another but for each other.

In saying this doesn't mean that the Catholic Church must tolerate everything, for if we do, we will teach nothing. The Church is not proposing nor suggesting that God's grace is distributed denominationally; the Catholic Church still believes that Jesus is the unique reflection of God, the fullness of divine revelation, and the church he founded is the Catholic Church. But at the same time, she recognises that all religions share in divine truth and in the works of God. In order to belong to Christ, what really matters is to get rid of anything which leads us away from God and to give "a cup of water to the needy" (Mk 9:41), which is to love God and our neighbour, we will soon proceed to love our own sect or Church more than Christianity, and then, of course, we will end up as slaves to selfishness by which we will become our own executioners.
