# Oh, Sacrament Most Holy!

Saturday 14<sup>th</sup> September is our parish Adoremus Day. It has been scheduled to coincide with the 53<sup>rd</sup> International Eucharistic Congress in Quito, Ecuador and the National Eucharist Congress at Oscott College. It is our day of recollection before the Lord in the Sacrament of the Eucharist. We will need to recollect in deep silence to have a one-on-one moment with the Lord.

I invite you, on that day, to intersperse vocal community prayers with long moments of silence of at least 20 minutes in every 30-minute slot to allow a personal conversation with the Lord. Let Jesus see the deep recesses of your heart (feelings), your mind (thoughts, doubts, certainties) and emotions (of joy and contentment or fear and anxiety). Present to him your past, present and future plans, and those areas of your life that you even fear to look at because of embarrassment. Allow him to touch and heal you. Let it be your personal encounter with the Lord.

It is rewarding to simply be present to the Lord who is also present to you in a very personal way and to avail yourself to him. I hope that you can experience the joy of unitive prayer with the Lord in the Sacrament of the Eucharist.

The moments of silence will reawaken your hunger and thirst for the spiritual nourishment that the Lord reserves for those who seek him. You will long to, 'taste and see that the Lord is good' (Ps. 34:9) and to clearly hear his invitation: 'Come to me, all you who labour and are burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart; and you will find rest for yourselves. For my yoke is easy, and my burden light (Mt. 11:28-30).

The Sacrament is the most holy and divine because in it is the Lord's mysterious presence; the Lord who is risen and who, out of his love for us, keeps close to us to enable us to experience the warmth of his care in the consecrated bread, his body; and the wine his blood.

When properly done, the Lord will effect a lot of good in your personal lives and support your commitment to unreservedly serve him in all areas of our life.
