FOR A SYNODAL CHURCH: COMMUNION, PARTICIPATION AND MISSION

This is the theme of the 16th Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops, commonly referred to as the Synod on Synodality. The three year synod is entering its second and final step that will take place in Rome on 2nd-27th October. According to *Instrumentum Laboris 2024*, the theme of the synod is a call to joy and to the renewal of the People of God in following the Lord and in their commitment to serving His mission. It is based on common baptismal identity and rooted in the diversity of the contexts in which the Church is present and finds its unity in the one Father, the one Lord, and the one Spirit.

As a parish community, we need to internalise the teaching of the Synod because it is a guide in our fundamental vocation to a life of holiness in the present-day contexts. Note that for the spirit of the synod to take root it must be adopted in the 'basic ecclesial cells': the families. It is there that listening, participation and mission must start so that they can be extended to the wider community.

We are being tasked to live as a synodal church that spontaneously exercises listening, speaking out, sharing responsibility for our common mission, dialoguing in church and society, engaging in ecumenism, and responsibly exercising authority and participation.

As a synodal church that is participatory and co-responsible, we will display the community spirit in the way we identify our common goals and strategise the way to reach them. Teamwork and co-responsibility serve as a bedrock in the exercise of authority or governance within a local Church that treasures the participation and responsibility of the lay ministries and the lay people.

We would like to experience the spirit of synodality in the functions of the parochial committees, such as the finance committee, pastoral council and others. Our aim is to foster a more synodal approach in our participation and leadership in our parish, deanery and Archdiocese. The coming weeks are introducing us to many opportunities to explore our identity as baptised people who are called to live as a synodal Church here in Coventry. Fr. Aloysius
