YOU MUST DO WHAT THE WORD TELLS YOU'

Christian life calls us to love God and fellow human beings. Our relationship with God is expressed in a faith that is lived and practiced in the right religion. Our continuous union with God and fellow Christians is lived and expressed in the Church community which is the mystical Body of Jesus. The Lord Jesus said, 'I am the Vine and you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing' (Jn15:5). As we are the branches we are, therefore, co-joined to each other by the vine. This means that it is a logical right that we should love each other and promote unity and peace as members of the same body of Christ. To strengthen this union and relationship we need to pray together as a parish community as well as within our families. We are renewed by receiving the sacraments, especially the Holy Eucharist in our daily or weekly Mass. How often do we keep the days of obligation of the Christian calendar? The commandments, the Church laws and doctrines of our faith guide and regulate our behaviour. We can pose questions about this today. Do we follow the commandments of the Lord and the Church laws as is expected of us? Why do we sometimes find it difficult to act on his word by fulfilling the practical aspects of the Christian practices of charity and generosity? Saint James said, 'Pure, unspoilt religion, in the eves of God our Father is this: coming to the help of the orphans and widows when they need it' (Jas1:27). Our faith should make us to be concerned for each other.

As we celebrate the 22nd Sunday, the readings invite us to be practical in living our faith. We should not be nominal Christians but rather the doers of God's word. In the first reading, Moses instructed the Israelites to follow the commandments if they were to enjoy the favours that the Lord had promised them. Their union with God and love for each other would be expressed in observing the laws. The laws promoted justice, peace, love and faithfulness among them. There is a similar instruction echoed in the Gospel. When the Pharisees complained to Jesus as to why the disciples were not respecting the tradition of the elders, he called them hypocrites. The Lord, had to correct the double standards and pretence of the Pharisees, who

bothered less about the needy and poor in the society and yet observed the laws to the letter. He even went further and quoted the prophet Isaiah, 'These people honours me only with lip-service, while their hearts are far from me...' (Mk7:6). As Christians today, let us make the effort to love God and fellow human beings. We must do this so that our faith and religion should have an impact upon our society and build a meaningful spiritual union with God.
