

'HE MAKES THE DEAF HEAR AND THE DUMB SPEAK'

People commonly refer to having, 'A sound body and a sound mind.' Our mental health and stability can mean that we experience a proper sense of living. When our faculties of life are sound, we tend to perceive the events of life with joy and hope. If we develop some inability, we tend to lose confidence and hope in life. There are ways and means to rectify some of these incapabilities, especially during this modern era of advanced science and technology. However, as Christians, we need supernatural intervention to balance our physical and spiritual realities so that we are able to act sensibly in life. As Christians, we need to have spiritual eves and minds to understand the way and will of God in the universe. It is not until we fully or partially understand why we live and where we are going, that we can begin to handle life with joy and hope. Just as the prophet Isaiah gave hope for the Israelites, 'Say to all faint hearts, Courage! Do not be afraid. Look, your God is coming...' (Is35:4). We all need an assurance and consolation in moments of difficulties. There should be that longing for the great consoler and comforter of our lives. Our faith should give us the courage to have sound body and mind and in this way we shall be able to hear and speak of God's loving and enduring presence in the events of our life.

As we celebrate the 23rd Sunday of the year, the readings invite us to eradicate all the barriers of our spiritual life. These are what makes us deaf and dumb to the will of God and needs of our brothers and sisters. Saint James advises strongly about blindness of disunity or division based of social status and distinctions. He says, 'My brothers, do not try to combine faith in Jesus Christ, our glorified Lord. with making of distinctions between classes of people....'(Jas2:1). It is our natural inclination always to associate with the people with whom we share some common interest and disregard others. Such an attitude takes us to spiritual deafness and dumbness. It is the same instruction echoed in the Gos-

pel, (Mk7:31-37), when Jesus healed the deaf and dumb man. On touching his ears and tongue, looking up to heaven, "..he said to him 'Ephphatha,' that is 'Be opened." The miracle demonstrates Divine power over evil as well as the abiding presence of The Most Holy Trinity. Secondly, it also shows that it is only when the teachings of Jesus are followed, that we can truly show love and be opened to each other as brothers and sisters. May we, therefore, seek the living presence of God through prayer and the sacraments. By doing so we will be spiritually sound in the body and in the mind.
