

THE CALL TO HOLINESS AND THE OBSTACLES!

According to the teachings of the Church, as drawn from her eternal leader our Lord Jesus, all of us are called to be holy. It is the means of achieving eternal salvation. Jesus said, 'Be perfect, just as your heavenly Father is perfect' (Matt5:28). On a similar note, the Catholic Catechism states that, 'All Christians in any state or walk of life are called to the fullness of Christian life and to the perfection of charity. All are called to holiness' (CCC 2013). To achieve some level of perfection in life, we should be aware of the obstacles that hinder or block the path to holiness. These may among others include self-seeking ambitions, pride, jealousy, lack of charity, doubts, unfaithfulness, materialism, selfishness and reckless behaviour. As Christians, we are invited to be generous, charitable, tolerant and accommodating and seek to consider each person that we meet as a child of God, not as 'other people.' Jesus corrected the erroneous view of the disciples who felt bad when someone other than them was casting out devils in Jesus' name. He said, 'You must not stop him: no one who works a miracle in my name is likely to speak evil of me. Anyone who is not against us is for us' (Mk9:38-39). We should work together and promote the good of each other as the disciples of the Lord.

As we celebrate the 26th Sunday, the theme of the readings invites us to be faithful disciples of the Lord. We should at same the time be sources of inspiration for others and not act as obstacles to their holy living. Our actions should align with our belief. In the first reading, Moses encouraged the Israelites to be messengers of hope by taking prophetic roles, like Eldad and Medad, who had not gone to the tent but received the same spirit for prophecy. Joshua requested Moses to stop them. Instead, Moses replied, 'Are you jealous on my account?' (Num11:25-29). It is a similar instruction that Jesus gave to the disciples as described in the Gospel. When they tried to stop a man who was casting devils in Jesus' name He said to the disciples 'Anyone who is not against us is for us' (Mk9:39). These excerpts are relevant to us today, because sometimes we are tempted to judge others as not worthy to do certain things. We take the place of God to judge and stop others from expressing their faith. We instil fear in some people by our comments and attitudes. In this way, we may become obstacles to someone's path of holiness. May we, therefore, be sources of inspiration and hope, by our example of generosity and charity. We should pay attention to what Saint James mentions, 'All your gold and your silver are corroding away, and the same corrosion will be your own sentence, and eat into your body (Jas5:3). We should use our wealth wisely and share it by caring for the needy. In this way we will initiate the joys of the heavenly kingdom.
