OCTOBER is the month dedicated to Our Lady of the Holy Rosary. The rosary is integral to the spiritual life of many Catholics in our countries and, if we deepen our understanding of the foundations of our rosary prayers, we can, in turn, deepen our devotion to Mary, the Mother of God. Devotion to Mary has always been at the heart of our life and worship as Catholics. Since medieval times in England and Wales, there has been a long-standing practice to pray the 'Hail Mary' at Mass after the last intercession of the Prayers of the Faithful. This seems particularly appropriate during the months of May and October, and for the key Marian Feasts. It's a good time to remember that Mary's 'yes' changed the world. At the Annunciation, Mary said 'yes' to the Angel Gabriel, who asked her to give birth to God's son, freely accepting God's will in her life. In March 2020, Catholics and other Christians across England took part in the re-dedication of the country to the Virgin Mary. The original dedication took place in 1381, when King Richard II made a series of 'entrustment vows' at Westminster Abbey on the feast of Corpus Christi. The country was in a period of turmoil and the King turned to the Virgin Mary for protection. The best way to celebrate the month is, of course, to pray the Rosary. So let us all turn to Our Blessed Lady and seek her intercession and ask that she will always be 'our most gentle Queen and Mother.'

QUARANT'ORE EUCHARISTIC ADORATION FESTIVAL

Thursday 3rd - Sunday 6th October 2024

'Sweet Sacrament divine: hid in thine earthly home'

Quarant'ore is the ancient tradition which is believed to have begun in Italy during the 16th century in honour of the forty hours during which the Body of Our Lord rested in the tomb.

The Forty Hours Devotion invites us to watch before the Lord, and in this extended period of adoration to offer in his presence our prayer for the Church and its mission.

Quaran'tore is an opportunity to commune with God. It offers a period of reflection where we can pause and take stock of our relationship with him, his mission for ourselves and how we are living out our vocation. It is an opportunity to move away from the busy schedule of our lives and simply be with the Lord. Everyone is encouraged to come and spend time with the Lord during these forty hours.

St Alphonsus Liguori once wrote, 'know also that you will probably gain more by praying fifteen minutes before the Blessed Sacrament than by all the other spiritual exercises of the day. True, Our Lord hears our prayers anywhere, for He has made the promise, 'ask, and you shall receive,' but He has revealed to His servants that those who visit Him in the Blessed Sacrament will obtain a more abundant measure of grace.'

Our Eucharistic Festival will be a wonderful opportunity for us to grow in love of the Lord himself, in the most precious gift of the Blessed Sacrament and to echo the words of Fr Francis Stanfield, 'Sweet Sacrament divine, hid in thine earthly home; lo, round thy lowly shrine, with suppliant hearts we come.' The Quarant'ore will also be interspersed with 'themed' Holy Hours, the Divine Offices and the Holy Rosary.

There are sign-up sheets at the back of church for people to volunteer to watch before the Lord during the Quarant'ore Eucharistic Festival. During the forty hours, there must be two people present in church to ensure the safety of the Blessed Sacrament.

There are leaflets available at back of both STM and SJW which gives further details about the times and schedule during these forty hours. Please do take a copy.

Everyone is encouraged to come along and spend some time in prayer before the Blessed Sacrament. St John Paul II said, 'the Eucharist is the secret of my day. It gives strength and meaning to all my activities of service to the Church and to the whole world.....let Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament speak to your hearts. It is he who is the true answer of life that you seek. He stays here with us: he is God with us. Seek him without tiring, welcome him without reserve, love him without interruption: today, tomorrow, forever.'

THE FEAST OF THE GUARDIAN ANGELS was first authorised in 1608 by Pope Paul V, in honour of Guardian Angels, then in the 1670s, Pope Clement X made October 2nd the official date for the Feast of Guardian Angels. Both Christians and non-Christians believe that angels exist, and their main job is to protect and guide us through our lives. We are encouraged to make the prayers to the Guardian Angels part of our daily routine.

O Angel of God, my guardian dear, to whom God's love commits me here, ever this day/night, be at my side, to light and guard, to rule and guide. Amen.

Matthew, Mark, Luke and John, bless the bed that I lie on. There are four corners to my bed, there are four angels round my head. One to watch, and one to pray, and two to bear my soul away. Now I lay me down to sleep, I pray the Lord my soul to keep. If I should die before I wake, I pray the Lord my soul to take. Amen.

Let us continue to pray for our sisters and brothers around the world who face a daily struggle for the necessities of life and in particular for the work of CAFOD.

MASS INTENTIONS: Over the last couple of weeks, there have been occasions where some of our daily Masses have been cancelled as we have been unable to find cover. If one of these Masses had been requested for your intentions, please note that they have been moved to the next available date.

SARAH COLLINS who has been the Headteacher at STM School since 2019 will be leaving at the end of this academic term. During her time as Headteacher she has guided the school through an Ofsted and S48 inspection and of course the educating of our children at home during the pandemic. We thank her for her dedication and witness to the school over the years and assure her of our prayers and every blessing as she prepares to begin a new chapter in her life.
