THE WORD OF THE LORD

The theme of today's readings: Seeking the Wisdom of God

First reading Wisdom 7:7-11 The inspired writer of the Book of Wisdom identifies himself with King Solomon, who petitioned God for wisdom. But what does it mean to possess the gift of wisdom? It means allowing oneself to be guided by the commands of God and acknowledging his sovereignty over one's life and all humanity. Wisdom also includes an understanding of the created world and human nature. This knowledge brings one closer to God and makes life happier and more fulfilling. The Church has always taught that there is no disunity between reason and the knowledge of faith. "Faith intervenes not to abolish reason but to bring human reason to understanding that in these events it is the God of Israel who acts" (Pope John Paul II, *Fides et ratio*, 16).

Psalm 90 The psalmist asks God for a heart of wisdom to guide him on his journey through life. He ends his prayer by petitioning God's favour in establishing his works through the hands of his chosen people. Since God chose Israel by divine election to be his holy people and a light to the Gentile nations, the psalmist asks that they might fulfil that mission as partners in God's plan for salvation history.

Second reading Hebrews 4:12-13 The writer uses the image of a two-edged sword as a metaphor for the ability of God to separate the truth from deception in the hearts of men and women. He warns the first generation of Jewish Christians that it is impossible to keep anything hidden from God, not even our thoughts are secret; God exposes all human weaknesses and failures, and all will have to render a final account when Christ returns to judge the living and the dead.

Gospel Mark 10:17-30 Like Solomon, a wealthy young man seeks what the psalmist calls "wisdom of heart." He knows that his earthly wealth can not assure his everlasting salvation, so he asks Jesus what he must do to find eternal life. First, Jesus tells him to obey the commandments concerning the love of God and neighbour. Then Jesus invites him to give up everything to follow him, asking him to fulfil what Jesus defined as the first and greatest commandment: to love the Lord God above everything else. Jesus makes the same loving invitation to us today: to take hold of the gift of Godly wisdom to be willing to give up the world to live fully for Christ and the sake of his Gospel of salvation. It is a decision that takes courage, but it is a decision that has eternity with Christ as its reward.

OPPOSE ASSISTED SUICIDE



"Devalued to death": activists with disabilities share fears about assisted suicide Bill From the Bishops of England & Wales: We are calling on Catholics in England and Wales to unite in prayer and compassionate action to oppose

assisted suicide. In early September 2024, when parliament returned and a Bill on assisted suicide – so-called 'assisted dying' – started its passage through the House of Lords, our Lead Bishop for Life Issues, Bishop John Sherrington, called for Catholics to unite in prayer and compassionate action. That call is renewed now as on Wednesday, 16 October, the House of Commons will hear the first reading of a new bill on assisted suicide tabled by Labour MP Kim Leadbeater. This is another attempt to legalise assisted suicide and we need you to contact your MP to voice your opposition.

Act now! Contact your MP

The charity 'Right to Life' has a simple online mechanism to do this. It takes little more than a few minutes to input your postcode. Submit the suggested message to ask your MP to stop assisted suicide being rushed into law. As Bishop Sherrington says, the legalisation of assisted suicide undermines the sanctity and dignity of human life. "The Catholic Church accompanies those suffering and nearing the end of their lives with hope and affection, but also reminds them that their life is precious until the very last breath," he says. "In preparation for these challenging debates, let us offer our prayers for those facing the end of their lives, that they may receive the care and support they need to live their final days with respect for their dignity. Let us also pray for our politicians and our country that wisdom and compassion may guide their decisions. I also urge all Catholics to become better informed about the serious problems associated with the legalisation of assisted suicide."

A leaflet is available at the back of church summarising the Church's reasons for opposing assisted suicide (perversely called 'assisted dying' by others).
