IT WAS FOR OUR GOOD THAT CHRIST WAS REVEALED IN OUR TIME:

When our dear Jane Goodyear passed on two months ago, I went to see the gentleman who was digging her grave. I wanted to ask him whether I could provide him with some water or a cup of coffee. He told me that he came equipped; he did not need anything. In the course of digging as I looked on, he came upon a layer of Oyster shells embedded in pure fine sea sand. How could they have gone there, and what happened that they were so many! I wondered. The man told me that the Oyster shells and the sand were there to point to an archaeological fact that our town of Nuneaton was at some stage part of the oceans where sea monsters lived before it became land. I took some shells for my further curiosity. They are very brittle because of having been buried beneath the earth for so many years.

Looking at the shells and the time they have been underground, an idea came to my mind concerning the revelation of Jesus Christ. If you reflect on the time when Nuneaton was part of the Ocean such that layers of ocean sand and Oyster shells can be found here, and compare it with the time when Our Lord Jesus Christ was revealed to us, we notice how nearer in terms of time Jesus is to us. Two thousand years since his birth, cannot be compared to the time Oyster shells have been hidden away in our Church compound. The birth of Jesus Christ becomes like an event that took place yesterday although 2000 years have passed!

The mystery of the Incarnation and of our becoming Christians, reminds us that there is something God wants to do with us through Jesus Christ. He positioned us at a time after the Incarnation so that we may have access to eternal life. Poor Oysters were long dead before Christ was born, but we human beings of our time, have come into existence long after God was revealed in Christ. Whatever God wants to do with us, is not plainly put on paper or written in black and white, but there must be a reason why we exist today; "yesterday is gone and tomorrow may not be mine" someone sang in the time past.

God has created us for a purpose; and stationed us here to respond to situations as he puts them before us. During this time of pastoral uncertainties, he expects us to respond by taking action today. Whether the action we take will bear fruits tomorrow, it is not our concern, the main point is to rise to the occasion today.

On Wednesday 16th October we have been invited by our area Bishop, Richard Walker and by our area Dean Mgr Tom Farrell, for a meeting to take place in our parish Church at 7:00pm. I encourage you to come and attend this meeting, to give your own suggestions on very important matters to be decided upon by yourselves. Looking at the situation and putting things into their context, I think that the things that bother our hearts as believers come about because we have often excused ourselves or thought that other persons can do better than ourselves. On the contrary, each one of us has a role to play which no one else can. I will be very pleased to see everyone here including the youth and the children. It is our mission, it is our church, it is our faith. Day by day, I come to realise that God has allowed us to exist today because he knows that we are the most qualified persons to implement his plan. I hope to see you on Wednesday.
