IT IS AN IMPORTANT GARMENT FOR SUNDAY

Every parish priest is constantly overcome with joy which comes from the Lord when he sees his people joining him for the Sunday Mass. As you are aware, the priest does not call them for Mass! Rarely do you find a physically attractive priest, he is an ordinary man. The priest does not send anyone to prison for missing the Sunday Mass, he cannot even deny anyone the Sacraments except for grave reasons. What brings people from their homes to gather round their priest on Sunday, is Jesus who summons them into his presence where his spokesman (the priest) is.

Every priest, when he goes to the altar, is conscious of what he is doing; in whose presence he stands, and in whose name he exercises the ministry. The Church has designed costumes to vest himself up once he stands in the presence of God. I can tell you that there are several layers of clothing on him when he is celebrating the sacraments, including Holy Mass; each one with its own symbolism.

When the people of God come into the presence of God, they too are obliged to come dressed up appropriately, their hair decently combed, their faces well washed and display dignified posture either when sitting or when standing. This is all because, we are standing in the presence of God. It is not a Christian custom for men to wear hats or any head covering in church. Therefore when a man comes into church with his hat on, it is our Christian duty to remind them to keep them in their pockets until the Mass is ended and they are out of the Church. Muslims take it as their duty to remind visitors to their mosque to take off their shoes and no one takes offence for that, instead they appreciate being reminded to do the right thing.

There is another garment that you should not miss to put on if God bestowed it upon you—the Wedding Ring. It is something so insignificant in dressing up, yet it is the most significant when you are going to Sunday Mass. When you extend your hands to receive Holy Communion with your wedding ring on your finger, you present to the Lord all that your wedding ring represents, the joys, the sorrows, the love and hope that you go through as a consecrated person in marriage. It tells who you are, and what you want to continue to be. Therefore when you are coming to Sunday Mass, please make sure that your wedding ring is on your finger as part of your celebration of the Lord's day.

The Wedding Ring puts off opportunistic admirers, yet its absence on someone's finger encourages genuine seekers. I don't encourage young unmarried people to wear what might seem to be a wedding ring on their fingers because it might communicate a message which in reality does not exist.

Please remember that the wedding Ring is not an ornament to decorate the fingers; it is a **Sign** of Jesus' love for you and of his Church. As a matter of fact, it becomes one of the most important garments to put on, on a Sunday when you are going to Mass.

Solemnity of All Saints will be celebrated on Friday 1st November. It is a Day of Obligation. There will be two Masses 9:30am and 7:00pm.

All Souls Day will be commemorated on Saturday 2nd November Mass at 9:30am for all the departed members of our families. Please come so that we can commend them to the mercy of God.

Ask for Mass for departed members of your family: During the month of November we remember the souls of our departed brethren. I encourage you to ask your priests to offer a Holy Mass for your relatives. There are a few envelopes available where you can put the names of the people you want Holy Mass to be offered for. It is recommended to put a Mass donation if possible. The Mass requests will be sent to Missionary priests of the Apostles of Jesus to be celebrated in their mission lands.

Blessing of the graves takes place on **Sunday 3rd November** after 9:15am & 11am Masses in the church graveyard and 3pm at Oaston Road cemetery.

Lost Baptismal Card: please note that your baptismal card or that of your child is a very important ecclesiastical legal document which you must keep safe just like your passport. Every week people call the office to have their baptism cards replaced because they cannot find the one given at baptism. It costs the parish a lot of money to carry this on. Starting from January next year 2025, it will cost £10.00 administration charge to have a lost baptismal card replaced.
