Mission Sunday and Our Christian Witness Today

We are celebrating this mission Sunday at the time when we are forming what we may define as our missionary parish council, that has work to do in our local and global communities. At the local level we are to reach out to those sections of our communities that need our love and services, and globally through our donations by supporting missionary agencies, and by volunteering to go and participate in those missions.

We are highly privileged to experience that sense of mission in our parish community today, and indeed in our deanery and archdiocese. The various activities taking place in our Church have a sense of mission: our liturgical services that are centred around the Holy Eucharist, the education and catechetical ministry in preparations for receiving the various sacraments, and the ministry of family life. The ongoing process of the formation of our parish council requires that we organise our parish programmes around the missionary perspective to better address the needs of our times.

For today's Mission Sunday, Pope Francis has provided the theme drawn from the words our Lord told his disciples: "Go therefore to the thorough fares and invite to the marriage feast as many as you find" (Matthew 22:9). Our Missionary work must address the needs of our times as Pope Francis teaches, 'in a world torn apart by divisions and conflicts, Christ's Gospel remains the gentle yet firm voice of the Gospel. Synodality is essentially missionary and, vice versa, mission is always synodal. Consequently, close missionary cooperation is today all the more urgent and necessary, both in the universal Church and in the particular Churches'.

Today, as we celebrate this Year's Mission Sunday, we acknowledge the heroism of all Christians who, in a variety of ways, embraced the mandate to be witnesses, followed into the footsteps and words of our Lord and bore their witness to the Lord by their words and deeds. It is because someone committed themselves to announce the gospel that we received the good news and became Christians. Thanks to the many who embraced this challenge as married couples, teachers, monks, friars, religious nuns and priests and bishops. We want to play our part today by actively engaging in the fields of evangelization as Christ's witnesses.
