Welcome to Mass today. We extend a special welcome to anybody joining us for the first time. Please introduce yourself, and if you are able, stay for refreshments after the Mass.

In the First Reading, Solomon prays for wisdom saying it is more valuable than power, wealth, and even health. This teaches us that true wisdom comes from God and is more precious than anything we can possess. Solomon's choice shows that seeking God's wisdom should be our priority. Worldly riches and honours are temporary and can lead us away from God. But wisdom helps us live according to God's will and leads us to eternal life.

The Second Reading from Hebrews tells us that God's word is alive and powerful. It is sharper than any two-edged sword, able to judge the thoughts and intentions of the heart. This reminds us of the power of God's word in our lives. God's word is not just written text; it is active and speaks to us personally. It reveals our innermost thoughts and guides us in the right path. We must read and reflect on the Scriptures, allowing them to shape our hearts and minds.

In the Gospel, Jesus encounters a rich young man who asks how to inherit eternal life. Jesus tells him to sell all he has, give to the poor, and follow Him. The young man is saddened because he has many possessions. Jesus' words show us that clinging to wealth can hinder our relationship with God. True discipleship requires letting go of material attachments and trusting fully in Jesus. Jesus assures His disciples that while it is hard for the rich to enter the Kingdom of God, nothing is impossible with God. This gives us hope. If we trust in God and seek His help, we can overcome the obstacles that keep us from following Jesus fully.

Let us pray. Lord, grant us the wisdom to seek Your will above all else. Help us to embrace Your word and detach ourselves from all the worldly possessions. Guide us in our journey of faith, so we may follow You faithfully and reach eternal life. Amen.
