With the generous help of people like you, The Johnson Association cares for over 65 elderly or unwell priests each year. Over the next ten years, we expect a further 55 priests to retire from active ministry. – and who knows how many might fall sick.


In the last financial year we awarded grants of almost £430,000 to the

Below is a graph of expected, Diocesan Priests, ages on 1st January 2025. All Priests have to offer their resignation at the age of 75. Therefore if we take a look at ALL those presently over 65 years of age we can expect up to 55 priests to retire in the next 10 years – and there are less than 20 priests under 50 years of age.

Rev. Father Patrick Armstrong who has chosen Bicester as his retirement home. Born in 1936, he was ordained in March 1971 and has served in parishes in Dudley Road, Lichfield, Sparkhill, Littlemore and Witney. Paradoxically, now that he has retired (2011) and is therefore not tied to a particular parish, he is busier now than when he was involved in parish ministry. The demands made on his time as supply cover for priests who are away from their parish for whatever reason and prompted by the overall shortage of priests in the diocese means that

on many weekends he is absent from Bicester and helping in other parishes.
