### "WHEN THERE WILL BE NO MORE TRAINING FOR WAR" Isaiah 2:4

November starts with the Solemnity of all the Saints, but apart from the Solemn liturgy of the day, the rest of the month is spent praying for the dead. I thank you for remembering these poor souls in your prayers. Many of them prayed for the people called before them, they need our prayers at this moment and when our turn will come, we shall need the prayers of those we shall leave behind. The visit to the cemetery last Sunday was well attended. This was an act of our firm belief in the mercy of God.

Today is Remembrance Sunday. We recall the painful death of our brethren who perished in war. I'm sure that the people who have never experienced war, talking about it, does not bring home the fact that it is one of the worst things that any sober mind would wish to incite or to see taking place anywhere on earth. War is evil and just war theory might not take into account the losses that are involved. The best way is to avoid war at any and every opportunity.

The primary ambition in war is the destruction of life, property and infrastructure of the enemy whether he is real or imaginary. This destruction does not exclusively target the combatants but non fighters, wildlife and vegetation is not spared either. The devil's venomous sting is hidden in the craft of war, turning friends into foes, such that man turns on man as though he was a monster!

'We shall remember them' is a common statement we hear on Remembrance Day. I'm not sure how many men and women who have power in their hands, mean what they say when they utter these words. The person who says those words is expected to imply that he/she regrets that the fallen gave up their today for my tomorrow, but I wouldn't wish to see more of that. However experience shows that the same people are busy making research on how life and property can be destroyed quicker and on a massive scale.

Remembrance Sunday calls on every living person to work for peace, to become a channel of peace and to wish no one anything else except peace. Let us try to think of so many young lives that never lived to experience the goodness of ageing. Think also of the old people who spent their life doing good and living peaceful lives, just to end their life at the violent hands of another man. We realise that to say 'we shall remember them' is not good enough without casting to the bottom of the sea the greed that abides in the human heart which leads to war.

War is a lucrative money maker for some people and governments. I'm sure that it will not be during my life time when we shall live in a world where there will be no ruined wall, no exile or when there will be no sound of weeping in our streets. I'm also sure that it will not be in my life time when there will be no more training for war. However we must start from somewhere by being peace makers. Do not buy a toy gun or a toy pistol as your son's birthday present, instead teach him from the start to hate violence and to value peace.
