FORMATION OF OUR PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL

Time has come to form our Parish Pastoral Council (PPC). As the title suggests, the purpose of a PPC is to help bring about the mission and vision of the parish. Canon Law is brief in its treatment of parish councils. Unlike the Finance Councils (Can 537) which are mandatory, parish pastoral councils are established by the diocesan bishop if he judges it necessary after hearing from the Council of priests. Parish Councils are presided over by the Parish Priest consequent of his role in representing the juridic needs of the parish. In addition to parishioners, the PPC should include in its membership, those who hold pastoral office such as assistant parish priests and deacons.

The PPC is consultative, it does not make laws, it supports the parish priest in the running of the parish by finding resources, employing expertise prudently advising him in what needs to be done for the fulfilment of **Evangelisation, Formation, Liturgy and Social Outreach**. The Council should operate according to the norms set out by the diocesan bishop (Canons 532, 536). It enjoys consultative voice but the parish priest should be mindful of the views expressed by a Parish Pastoral Council especially when there is a consensus (Canon 127 §2, °2).

The PPC can have office holders such as the secretary or assistant parish priest. However, a document *Ecclesiae de mysterio, 1997 art.5 n.3°* clarifies that "actions cannot be decided in the absence of the parish priest, hence they are to be considered invalid, null and void any deliberations entered into or decisions taken by a Parish Council which has not been presided over by the parish priest or which has assembled contrary to his wishes". Of course there can be extreme cases when the parish priest and the Parish Pastoral Council are not singing from the same page.

The archbishop has decreed that in the present pastoral climate, Parish Pastoral Councils be formed within this year 2024 as bodies of "ecclesial co-responsibility" in the evangelisation of each parish. I wish to ask you to write down for me the people who you think could serve our parish in that capacity.

Since the pastoral council will act as people's representative, the eyes and ears of the Parish priest, the person you nominate "must be blameless, never arrogant or hot tempered, nor a heavy drinker of wine, or violent or obsessed by personal profit; but a person who is hospitable and a friend of all that is good, sensible, moral, devout and self controlled. The person must have a firm grasp of the unchanging message of our Catholic teaching, so that he/she can be counted on, for both expounding the sound doctrine, and refuting those who argue against it, so that the message of God is never disgraced (Titus 1:7-9, 2:6).
