BIBLICAL WIDOWS IN SERVICE AND ALMSGIVING

This Sunday's readings provide us with an opportunity to learn from two biblical widows. The first book of Kings narrates how a widow, faced with the effects of the devastating drought (9th century before Christ), believed prophet Elijah and brought to him her only handful of a meal in a jar and a little oil in a jug that she had preserved for herself and her son. The prophet used his power to multiply the food stuffs that sustained them for the three years of the drought. The prophet too was sustained by the same food and continued with his ministry of the Word. In the Gospel reading, Jesus pointed to the poor widow as one who put the most in the treasury because she put in the little she had to live on, everything she possessed (Mark). Both widows have a message for us in relation to service and almsgiving, because their donations sustained the work of God's prophets among his people.

Reflecting on those two Biblical widows brings me to sentiments of gratitude and encouragement. Our parish thrives on the donations and Sunday offering that you, the parishioners, give with devotion. These come in different forms as offertory and second collections to support various causes; others come in form of food stuffs and beverages, voluntary services in the teaching of the Catechism, singing in the choir, serving at the altar, proofreading and editing our publications, laundering our altar linens, preparing rotas for readers and eucharistic ministers, accounting and preparing first class reports for our auditors. All these keep our parish community vibrant. Thank you!
