Safeguarding: Let us Talk About It!

This Sunday, 17th November, launches us into the Safeguarding week with the theme: 'Let us talk about it'. We join thousands of churches from diverse backgrounds and traditions across the UK to make safeguarding a big issue to help protect vulnerable people. We cannot leave to chance matters of protection for children and vulnerable people, it is important that we are proactive. We must consciously develop practices that positively enhance good practice to respectfully relate with all people without exploiting and abusing their simplicity and goodness.

Defending the rights of vulnerable people is integral to Christian faith and teaching. It is deeply regrettable that in the past the church has been negligent and there have been serious cases of sexual, emotional, physical and psychological abuse. Some crimes related to safeguarding were done by some members of the clergy and other responsible persons such as parents and professional leaders. But we have a chance to change that. We are already seeing many churches take the responsibility to safeguard those in their care seriously.

Thanks to 2024 <u>Thirtyone:eight</u> a charity registered in England and Wales No: 1004490, that has provided us with the resources to support our reflections on this important subject. We are celebrating the Safeguarding Sunday on the Thirty Third Sunday in Ordinary Time and the Word of God focuses our attention on life after death that has the themes of: death, judgement, heaven and hell (Catechism of the Catholic Church). Faith in everlasting life helps us to align our conduct to what we are meant to be, the members of the human family that have an eternal future with God. In the meantime, we are preparing for that hope by a life of prayer, devotion, and respectful relationships with other people, and care for the vulnerable persons in our society.

Here in our parish, 'Let's talk about it'. About this our Archbishop writes: 'It is time to have open and honest conservations about what we got wrong and what we're getting right. It is an opportunity to talk about how we can work together to prevent abuse and create a world where every child and adult can feel safe and be safe.'
