THE GENEROSITY OF CHRISTIAN LIFE!

One of the basic principles of Christian life is a self-emptying sacrifice for God and for our fellow human beings. The uniqueness of Christian faith is drawn from what the founder, Our Lord Jesus Christ, said, 'If anyone wants to be my follower, he must deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me' (Lk9: 23). Saint Paul said, 'Have this in mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus, who though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God, a thing to be grasped, but emptied himself....' (Phil2: 5-8). In any human setting, or when we have a responsibility, if there is no self-emptying service taking place then contrary situations can arise. Such situations occur in families, communities and within organisations. Most disagreements are caused by a lack of self-emptying and generosity. Unless we learn the value of self-sacrifice it will be difficult to be generous to our families or even to faith communities such as our parish and other charitable organisations.

Today, we celebrate the 32nd Sunday of the year. The theme of the readings invites us to surrender our lives to serve God and our fellow human beings with humble and sincere generosity. The stories of the two widows in the first reading(1Kings17:10-16) and in the Gospel (Mark12:38-44), are accounts of how they both made true and sincere sacrifices of what was dear to them. The widow in the first reading told the prophet Elijah that she was preparing their last meal which they would eat and then die, meaning this was the last drop of food in their life. But when the prophet insisted on having her help she gave him what he wanted. She was then rewarded with a continuous supply of food. It is a similar situation in the Gospel. The poor widow who had contributed the few copper coins on which her life depended was considered to be the greatest contributor into the treasury. This was despite the large sums of money the rich had placed. Jesus said, 'For they contributed out of abundance, but she out of her poverty has put in everything she had, all she had to live on.' It is therefore, worthy to note that the Lord sees our inner motives of actions and does not assess how much we do or how much we offer. We are invited to be generous and humble in helping our families, parishes and

communities. We should avoid pride and showing off in the hope that this will make people admire us. Rather than this, we should serve the Lord with sincere hearts and right attitudes. Just as our Lord gave his life as ransom for many, may we learn to be generous and humble in our faith journey.
