# **CHRIST THE UNIVERSAL KING!**

The term Kingship implies that there is the presence of leadership contained within a domain or kingdom. It also points to a sense of influence and the organisation of a society that has values, traditions and rules which need to be followed and adhered to. Any kingdom aims to promote the common good of all its citizens, especially the most vulnerable. Above all, for us Christians, the King for our integral life is Christ. The Lord Jesus said, "The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy, but I have come that they may have King of Pedde life, life in its fullness" (Jn10:10). As our leader and guide, Christ gave up his life on the



Cross to reconcile us to the Eternal Father. It is, therefore, imperative that we should model our lives according to his Gospel values which are based on love, generosity, piety, honesty, justice and mercy. His is the kingdom within us. It has no geographical or political boundaries, because he is the author of the universe and life. Just as we are guided by human leaders to observe societal rules and norms, our Christian focus of life should be guided by Christ. He should be our point of reference when we are making moral, social and spiritual decisions. If we fail to focus on Christ as our leader and guide, we can easily make errors in our lives in the name of human rights and freedom.

As we celebrate the last Sunday of Liturgical year B, the theme of the readings invites us to focus on Christ as the King of our lives. The Solemnity of Christ King was instituted by Pope Pius XI in 1925 after the turmoil of the 1st World War. It was inviting the world community to focus on Christ as the true leader of peace. His reign in our world, hearts and minds should promote peace and reconciliation. If we live in revenge, violence, and bear grudges then we do not consider him as our leader and guide. Incidentally, today we live in an unsettled world of fear, violence and wars. May the peace of Christ touch each one of us to promote harmony and not discord. In today's Gospel, when Jesus was guestioned by Pilate whether he was a King, he said, 'Yes, I am a King. I was born for this I came into the world for this: to bear witness to the truth' (Jn18:37). Unless we are led by the truth, we can lose our sense of humanity. Can we imagine, how many lives have been lost in the recent conflicts in the world? Jesus also said 'I am the Way. and the Truth and Life' (Jn14:6). May we, therefore, surrender our lives to Christ the King as our Lord, King, and Saviour. We should also promote forgiveness and reconciliation in our communities and families. Jesus is the King of love and peace, we should remember his words, 'I give you a new commandment, love one another as I have loved you' (Jn13:34). May the King of the Universe reign in our hearts, families, parishes and the world.
