THE WORD OF THE LORD

On this last Sunday of Advent, the readings reveals the identity of the Messiah whose coming God promised from the time of Adam's fall from grace (Genesis 3:15) and foretold down through the centuries through his holy prophets.

First reading *Micah* 5:2-5*a* One of those prophets was the 6th century BC prophet, Micah. He reveals that the Messiah is more than a mortal man; he will be a ruler whose origin is "from ancient days." The faithful must look for his mother to give birth in Bethlehem, the city of the great King David, with whom God made an eternal covenant and promised that an heir from David's lineage



birth in Bethlehem, the city of the great King David, with whom God made an eternal covenant and promised that an heir from David's lineage would rule forever. Micah also prophesies that the Davidic Messiah's rule will be universal, reaching "to the ends of the earth."

Psalm 80 comes from a communal lament of the people of Israel when they were threatened with destruction and exile by the Assyrians in the 8th century before Christ. They pleaded for God's intervention to save them, despite their failures. They petitioned God to send a man chosen by God upon whom his favour rests, to save them from destruction. God sent such a man to save his holy people at the turning point in salvation history. "Son of Man" is Jesus' favourite title for Himself. He came to save not only the "lost sheep" of Israel but to redeem *all humanity*.

Second reading Hebrews 10:5-10 Jesus is the promised Davidic heir. He is both the son of David and the Son of God, destined to reign as an eternal King. Jesus is the High Priest of the New Covenant. Unlike the high priests of the Sinai Covenant, selected because of their hereditary link to Aaron, the first high priest, Jesus Christ is God's choice. He is sent by the Father and comes to do the Father's will.

Gospel Luke 1:39-45 When Mary visits Elizabeth, the baby in Elizabeth's womb, St. John the Baptist, filled with the Holy Spirit, leaped for joy to be in the presence of the Redeemer and Messiah in Mary's womb. Elizabeth, inspired by the Holy Spirit, declared that Mary is "the mother of my Lord" who has honoured her with his presence. Do you also recognise Jesus's true identity? Is he your Lord and God who came to save you from your sins and set you on the path to eternal life? If so, rejoice like St. John the Baptist and Elizabeth because your understanding of Jesus's true identity as the Son of God and our Saviour is a gift from the Holy Spirit.

JUBILEE YEAR 2025: PILGRIMS OF HOPE The Jubilee Year 2025 opens Christmas Eve, 24th December at 7pm with the Rite of the Opening of the Holy Door at St. Peter's Basilica in Rome immediately before Pope Francis celebrates Midnight Mass. The Holy Door represents the passage to salvation which Jesus opens to humanity. Archbishop Bernard will be celebrating a Mass for the Solemn Opening of the Jubilee Year at St Chad's Cathedral at 11.30am on Sunday 29th December, the Feast of the Holy Family. Next Sunday he will speak about the Jubilee Year in a pastoral letter. May the Jubilee Year be an opportunity for all of us to be renewed in hope in these troubled and confusing times, to experience afresh forgiveness and salvation in Jesus Christ, and to proclaim him as the Only Hope of the World.

FOUNDATIONS OF FAITH

This is open to all, with an emphasis on communicating the Church's teaching on the basics (foundations) of our Faith. Our first session will be on Creation and the Fall.
