We had some wonderful nativity plays at St Anne's school - by Reception and Y1: the singing in particular was very impressive - real fitting praise to the Christ-child. And we had an amazing Carols and Cake experience at Corpus Christi: Y6 had made cards for us, sang for us, danced for us, waited on us and chatted to us. It was lovely, and everyone left with a spring in their step!

Advent without Confession is like a Christmas Tree without decorations: what's the point? If we are not willing to clean out our souls ready for Christ to enter this Christmas, then in what way are we longing for him? **RAFFLE** We're having a normal raffle at St Anne's this Christmas - and hopefully try the bigger one for Easter. Donations of prizes gratefully received. Tickets on sale in the porch at both churches.

**KARIS COMMUNITY CENTRE** We're getting there! It's all a bit scary when we're dealing with such large sums of money, but it's exciting too, so, after nearly 2 years of preparation we've now sent our new contract to the diocese for approval, after our Parish Council and Finance Committee unanimously approved it. If we get permission - and if Building Control are happy with things - work will start early in January. We can afford the contract. Unfortunately, the only way of doing that was to forego underfloor heating and revert to radiators. Underfloor is better in many ways - ecologically and comfort-wise - and it is a now or never things, while the floor is up, but bottom line is it would have cost us £30-35,000 extra, so unless someone volunteers to make inroads into that in the next two weeks, we have to let our heads rule us and go for radiators. We still will have to refurbish the centre too, so in January, I'll be asking us to roll our sleeves up for another communal task, but it will actually allow us to really own the centre and I think it's more appealing to buy tangible things like new tables etc, than it is to give to a pot that we don't see - if you know what I mean.
