"Always winter and never Christmas":

In the second chapter of C.S. Lewis' book The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe, little Lucy stumbles through the back of a wardrobe into the imaginary country of Narnia. Although it's summer in England (where the wardrobe sits), it's winter in Narnia. Shivering in the cold, Lucy soon meets a faun, Mr. Tumnus, who tells her what wintertime is like in Narnia. The wintertime is perpetual, says Mr. Tumnus, and is the result of someone called the White Witch. "It's she who makes it always winter (here)," Tumnus says, "Always winter and never Christmas; think of that!" (2) — What a wonderful description of a world without Christ: "Always winter and never Christmas . . ."
