WE MUST MANIFEST CHRIST AT EVERY STAGE OF LIFE

We are half way through Advent, today is *Gaudete* (Rejoice) *Sunday*. For the people of the Northern Hemisphere, there seems to be nothing much to rejoice about; the beautiful sun is far from us, the ground is wet and soggy, the trees are bare with no leaves or fruits, farm animals are kept indoors, there seems to be nothing left to cheer our hearts! It is within this lifeless and miserable world, that the word of God calls upon us to wake up, to rejoice, to cheer, to shout out with joy *because the Lord is redeeming his people*. This is the Good news.

The past week has been full of activity centred on Christ. The little children of Key Stage One from Our Lady and St. Joseph Primary School, performed a beautiful Christmas play on Monday. I admired the imagination of children of how the first Christmas might have looked like. I came to realise that to understand the real meaning of Christmas, we ought to approach it with a humility of heart.

On Thursday the students from St. Thomas More led us into a youthful Advent which was more thought through. Every move was calculated, appearance mattered, clarity was important. It brought within me a feeling of how we must be mindful of our clarity in what we believe and be able to articulate it.

This Sunday 22nd, the senior choir of our parish, will lead us into a Carol service which, as I imagine, will be more traditional in its approach; no innovation no deviation from the tune, 'this is how it has always been done'! While there was less personal creativity with Key Stage One pupils, there was a lot of creative imagination with the Secondary school students. With the senior parish choir, I can guess that there will be an unshakable desire to be faithful to the traditions of Christmas celebration.

I really wish each one a blessed Christmas; for us, it is not an event but a person Jesus Christ himself that is celebrated this season. Christmas is not for children, it is not for the youth and it should not be left to the seniors in age, it is for everyone. Make it a personal celebration of your Saviour's birth.

His Grace the Archbishop encourages Christians from across the archdiocese to appreciate the dedicated service their priests give. Whichever parish you intend to go for Mass at Christmas, please pray for your priest. Be mindful to involve them in the joy and cheer that Christmas brings.
