First Sunday of Advent Year C

Readings: Jer. 33:14-16; Ps.25; 1st Thessalonians 3:12-4:2; Lk. 21:25-28, 34-36

Don't Fear, Trust in Him!

Have you ever been so worried about something that was about to happen that you found it difficult to think about anything else? You may even have begun to have sleepless nights over it. Maybe it was a family event, your wedding day, important job interview, or your meeting with someone you had fallen out with years before. Then when the actual day arrives things seem to go smoothly and all is well. At the end of the day you sit back and think, "Why did I worry so much?" Of course there are times when we have been concerned about something in the future and it doesn't work out smoothly. But even then it doesn't tend to be as bad as the worst-case scenarios we play through our heads. There is a tendency to want to know how things will turn out in the end. If we know what will happen we can take control of our lives and set things up so that we remain in control.

As we begin anew Liturgical Year this Advent, we focus our attention to the future coming of Lord, remaining conscious and alert about now in our personal life. There are people whose lives are dominated by fear. There are nations in tumult such as Sudan, Ukraine-Russia, Gaza, Lebanon-Israel e.g. There are signs in sun, moon and stars testifying to the consequences of our actions. Yet, it is in the midst of these situations that Jesus tells us to be confident, to stand erect, lift our heads high - to focus on the one who comes with liberation and freedom.

The two cardinal points around which the whole mystery of the Church and every Christian revolves are the *Incarnation* and the *Resurrection* of Christ. These two are the principal events in the Church liturgical Year, around which it revolves as a door on its hinges. All the other feasts and celebrations of the Church during the year are either directed to or flow from these two focal points. During liturgical year, the Church invites us, her children, day by day, week by week, to the table of the Word and of the Eucharist to be fed and nourished.

The liturgical Seasons of Advent reminds us of our identity as people of hope, people waiting for the Second Coming of Christ. This season is an open invitation to all Christians to live lives with a yearning to meet Christ at his Second Coming. This would mean readiness to face all sorts of painful and disappointing realities of life with unshakable hope in the 'beyond' – His Second Coming.

When Christ becomes the foundation and destiny of our life, our faith in the coming of the Lord can be an inspiration beyond any comparison. If we believe in Christ, we will have inexhaustible energy to live in Christ even in the face of frustrating situations and it will help us to hope against hope. For all Christians, then, the season of Advent is a call to become living witnesses of hope and encouragement to those imprisoned in cells of frustration and disappointment. This season invites us to become lighthouses for those who have lost direction in life. When we live our lives in this manner, we will be able to welcome the day of the Lord as those waiting for the bridegroom. Their ardent cry is Maranatha, Come, Lord Jesus!
