HAPPY NEW YEAR!

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ, I wish you a blessed and happy new Year 2024 - 2025. On this First Sunday of Advent, we have started the new liturgical year that comprises four seasons: Advent and Christmastide, Lent, Eastertide, and the Ordinary Time. Our year is Christocentric, it revolves around the lifetime of our Lord Jesus Christ.

The season of Advent is one of joyful waiting for the great arrival of God's promised Messiah, the anointed one whose coming was announced by the prophets of the Old Testament, and whose birth and epiphany brought immense joy to the world.

Of course, the one we are waiting for, the one whose birth we shall celebrate on Christmas day, is the one who has already arrived. We have already received him, but we still wait for his Second Coming.

At the start of this new year, it is recommended that we examine how we hold on to the buttresses of our faith: our prayer life, family values, practice of the sacramental life, works of charity and generally our discipleship of Jesus Christ. We then make fresh resolutions to focus on our determination to do better.

At this year's Christmas vigil, Pope Francis will launch the Jubilee Year 2025, with the theme: "Pilgrims of Hope". The current practice of celebrating Jubilee Years in the Roman Catholic Church goes back to Pope Boniface VIII who, in the Papal Bull 'Antiquorum Habet Fida Relatio', instituted the year 1300 AD as a Jubilee Year. Please note that "Jubilee Year" has biblical foundations, as we read in the Book of Leviticus: "Count off seven sabbath years—seven times seven years—so that the seven sabbath years amount to a period of forty-nine years. Then have the trumpet sounded everywhere on the tenth day of the seventh month; on the Day of Atonement sound the trumpet throughout your land. Consecrate the fiftieth year and proclaim liberty throughout the land to all its inhabitants. It shall be a jubilee for you; each of you is to return to your family property and to your own clan' (Leviticus, 25: 8 -10).

With all that we anticipate in the coming times, I wish you all a Blessed and Happy New Year 2024-2025.
