GAUDETE! Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say rejoice!

We declare today the joy of salvation! Joy is the outcome of an encounter with God's mercy. It is expressed in ways that include shouting, singing and dancing, and even in the silence of a joyful heart there is a sense of optimism and+ feeling good. Such joy is like light - it brightens those who witness it in an individual. It is a gift of the Holy Spirit, and St Paul names it among the fruits of the Spirit alongside love, peace forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control (Galatians 5:22-23). It is also an effect of innocence, an expression of genuineness of a person and a quality of sanctity.

Sin takes joy away from a person since it severs the soul from God. In brief, a life that excludes God experiences gloom and a sense of despair. This is the way we could interpret incidents of social traumas, destruction, divisions, war, violence and all forms of abuse against human persons. These situations, however, can be reversed, once a people acknowledge their state of sinfulness and need for God.

To experience joy, every generation of people must seek union and reunion with God in acts of repentance, reconciliation, forgiveness and mercy. This was true too for the crowds of the first century that that listened to John the Baptist as he preached the baptism of repentance. Various categories of people went to him with the question: What then shall we do? John responded to each according to their statuses in the community: tax collectors, soldiers, farmers, shepherds, priests, builders and others in the crowds. The bedrock of the prophet's message to all was the call to repentance from acts of greed and exploitation of the poor and to adopt acts of generosity and mercy.

Throughout our lives, as Catholics, we have many opportunities to approach the sacrament of reconciliation in which we confess our sins and receive God's forgiveness. This sacrament is powerful indeed; penitents confess their sins as a sign of their determination to do things differently. They express their intention to turn to God's ways, they receive God's forgiveness which showers them with immense joy and peace; it also frees them to be ambassadors of God's mercy to others. It is that experience of forgiveness that highlights our awareness of the powerful God that is in our midst and therefore the reason for great rejoicing. We shall always rejoice in the Lord who saves us. We shall therefore sing aloud, shout with exaltation because your powerful and merciful God is in our midst (Zephaniah 3:17).
