Through our readings, we are invited to reflect on themes of joyful return, partnership in the gospel, and clearing the path for Jesus.

Let us pray. Lord, help us prepare our hearts for Your coming. Guide us to remove obstacles that keep us from You. Strengthen our love and faith as we journey together. Amen.

OUR NEWSLETTER for the next month or two will be a double edition each week and will also include the Scripture Readings for Sunday Mass. Previously, SJW and STM had different ways of providing the readings to the congregation, so this new way means that all Masses are following the same format.

MASS CARDS: If you require a card with the Order of Mass text, please ask one of the welcomers for a copy.

RORATE MASSES will take place at 7.00am on Tuesday mornings in the side chapel at STM. The Rorate Caeli Mass is a traditional Advent devotion wherein the Mass of the Blessed Virgin Mary for Advent is offered just before dawn. The Mass is lit only by candlelight and because it is a votive Mass in Mary's honour, white vestments are worn instead of Advent violet. In the dimly lit setting, we prepare to honour the Light of the world, who is soon to be born, and offer praise to God for the gift of Our Lady. As the Mass proceeds and sunrise approaches, the church becomes progressively brighter, illumined by the sun as our faith is illumined by Christ. After the Mass, tea, coffee and toast will be available in the MRR.

ON FRIDAY'S there will be an extra Mass at 12noon in SJW which will be followed by a light soup lunch.

ADVENT HOLY HOUR: The Great Advent Antiphons, known as the 'O' antiphons are prayed before the Magnificat at Evening Prayer. Each antiphon is based on a title for Jesus taken from the Old Testament. Today most people know them from the Advent Carol, 'O Come, O Come Emmanuel.' During the Holy Hour on Thursday 19th December, we will listen to the scripture passages and meditate on the different titles of Christ as we prepare for his coming at Christmas.

ADVENT CONFESSIONS: In readying ourselves for the final coming of the Lord the Church encourages us to make our confession during the Advent season. Do give some thought to going to Confession during Advent — especially if it has been some time since you last came. After all, Confession is a celebration of God's mercy. As well as the usual times at STM on Saturday evening (4.15pm — 4.45pm) and at SJW on Saturday morning (10.30am — 11.00am). There will also be a Penitential Service with visiting priests available for Confession.

WARWICK UNIVERSITY MASS at SJW will begin again on January 12^{th} at 12.45 pm. A number of students will be returning home for the Christmas holiday, so we wish them safe travels and a blessed time with family and friends.

ON MONDAY the church celebrates the transferred Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Patroness of the Archdiocese of Birmingham. The title of the Immaculate Conception recognises Mary's privilege of coming into the world free from sin. On this day, the Church celebrates this special privilege given to Mary and in the Mass, we can thank her for watching over and protecting all people.

ROSARY, MASS AND PROCESSION on Monday evening at STM. To help celebrate the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, at 6.40pm we shall pray the Rosary for peace in the world, followed by 7.00pm Mass. This will conclude (weather permitting!) with a candlelight procession to the Shrine of Our Lady at STM.

BLESSING OF STRAW AND BAMBINELLI at all Masses next week, 14th and 15th. The straw that is blessed can be taken away and placed in your homes, in your Christmas Crib or beneath the tablecloth which covers the table for Christmas Day lunch. It symbolises that our homes become little Bethlehem's where we make Christ and our visitors welcome. YEAR OF JUBILEE: Pope Francis has declared that 2025 will be a year of Jubilee. The theme is 'Pilgrims of Hope' and is a year of hope for a world suffering the impacts of war, the ongoing effects of COVID-19 pandemic, and a climate crisis. The Jubilee Year is a time to re-establish a proper relationship with God, with one another, and with all of creation. the concept of Jubilee or 'Holy Year' was used to declare special years for forgiveness and reconciliation.



The first Jubilee was declared by Pope Boniface VIII on 22nd February 1300 (Feast of the Chair of St. Peter), to mark the beginning of that century. He later recommended it occurring every 100 years.

Various other Popes changed the length of the interval between the observances. But Pope Saint Paul II set the present 25-year interval in the 1500s. So Holy Years are "ordinary" when they occur at regular intervals – 25 years in these modern times – and 'extraordinary' when they are proclaimed for a very special reason.

More recently a Great Jubilee was declared in 2000 by Pope Saint John Paul II to celebrate the new millennium. That Jubilee year brought the total number of universal Jubilee years to 28 that so far had been celebrated by the Church.

Intended as a time of conversion and emphasis on God's mercy and forgiveness of sins, Jubilees begin with the opening of the Holy Door in St. Peter's Basilica. Holy Doors at each of the four papal basilicas in Rome are destination points for pilgrims, who pass through seeking special graces.

The Jubilee Year will run from the opening of the Holy Door in St Peter's Basilica in Rome, on Tuesday 24 December 2024 to the Feast of Epiphany 2026.

FIRST READING

Baruch 5:1-9

Take off the garment of your sorrow and affliction. O Jerusalem, and

In the fifteenth year of the reign of Tiberius Caesar, Pontius Pilate being governor of Judea, and Herod being tetrarch of Galilee, and his brother Philip tetrarch of the region of Ituraea and Trachonitis, and Lysanias tetrarch of Abilene, during the high priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John the son of Zechariah in the wilderness. And he went into all the region around the Jordan, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. As it is written in the book of the words of Isaiah the prophet, 'The voice of one crying in the wilderness: "Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight. Every valley shall be filled, and every mountain and hill shall be made low, and the crooked shall become straight, and the rough places shall become level ways, and all flesh shall see the salvation of God."
