## "Do whatever he tells you."

We start ordinary time with the lovely event of the Wedding at Cana. It completes Christmas' revealing of Jesus - this time in power and glory, though even now, only quietly to those with the eyes of faith. That is quite powerful: Christmas to the shepherds, the Epiphany to the wise men, his Baptism, only recognised as special by John and those whom he told - and now the wedding at Cana, just to Mary, the servants and some of his followers. Jesus reveals huge mysteries, but always quietly, simply - open only to those who aer willing to ponder them in their hearts, like Mary.

The first reading draws out the beauty of God wanting to marry us - when he sees you, he sees his beloved bride. And it is for this reason that Christ reveals himself in glory at a wedding.

We love stories, more than teaching - but this story contains the most important moral teaching of all: 'Do whatever he tells you." Obedience. It is our way to salvation. We pray daily: hallowed be your name; your kingdom come, your will be done: we say it, but do we mean it? Is your heart's desire his will or yours?

**FIRST CONFESSION AND HOLY COMMUNION** Letters and application forms are in the porch, to enrol your child for these great sacraments. First preparation session is very soon: Thursday 30th January, 6pm at Corpus Christi.

**PIETY STALL AND LIBRARY** Our volunteers from Corpus Christi who are going to be overseeing our lending library in the porch, and a small, simple piety stall, have started getting things organised. If there's anyone from St Anne's who wants to come on board, please see me.

**PARISH COUNCIL** Great meeting this Saturday - thank you. Some tough but good discussions. In particular, we discussed the constitution of the Parish Council itself, the Jubilee Year, Home Mission, the Consecration of St Anne's, the Karis centre and projectors etc. for the churches. More info will follow.

**KARIS COMMUNITY CENTRE** We're still on course for work to start January. Diocesan approval came in this week; building control are inspecting this coming week; the contract is close to being agreed, and then it's good to go. It's probably best for it not to start during this week's very cold spell, so digging will start next Wednesday, 29th. Please keep the project in your prayers. We'll need a meeting in February, for all those who want to help in sorting out the furnishing of the place. I'll explain more beforehand, but I think this is our last big step, and it is something that most of us can help with - so please be generous in coming to that meeting, and playing your part.

**BOTH CHURCHES** The Parish Council has agreed to go forward with getting projectors and screen for both churches. So far I have heard that there are 'deaf spots' in Corpus Christi, and that the loop system at St Anne's isn't great. I could do with help and more feedback in getting to the bottom of what is needed. It would also help to have some volunteers who know what they're talking about regarding what's available, too.

**CHILDREN'S LITURGY** starts at St Anne's this Sunday. Children should be old enough to join in without a parent and young enough not to have received their First Holy Communion - so roughly 4-8 years old, I'd say. It's a new thing, so please be patient. I'll invite the children to come forward after the Opening Prayer.
