INAUGURATING THE JUBILEE YEAR IN OUR LADY OF THE ANGELS PARISH

Pope Francis announced that 2025 will be a Jubilee Year, for all the baptised something which happens every 25 years; the next jubilee in the Church will be in the year 2050. The theme for Jubilee 2025, is "Pilgrims of Hope. A year of hope for a world suffering the impacts of wars, the ongoing effects of COVID-19 pandemic, and the climate crisis. A Jubilee at this time, is an event of great spiritual, ecclesial, and social significance in the life of the Church.

A Jubilee has its origin from the Bible; Leviticus 25: 8-17 states:

"You are to count seven weeks of years, seven times, seven years that is forty nine years. On the tenth day of the seventh month, you shall sound the trumpet on the Day of Atonement throughout the land. You will declare this fiftieth year sacred and proclaim the freedom of all the inhabitants of the land. This is to be a jubilee for you; each of you will return to his ancestral home. During the jubilee year, you will not sow, you will not harvest the un-gathered corn; you will not gather the untrimmed vine. The jubilee is to be a holy thing to you, let no one wrong his brother. If you buy from your neighbour, the greater the number of years the higher shall be the price demanded, the less the number of years, the greater the reduction . Let none of you wrong his neighbour, but fear your God, I'm Yahweh your God."

The biblical requirement is that the Jubilee year was to be treated like a Sabbatical year, with the land lying fallow. It required the compulsory return of all property confiscated to its original owners or their heirs. The land was to be given rest because it belonged to Yahweh. It was not to be sold by anyone forever. A jubilee was a time of total spiritual, physical and social transformation.

The Year began with the opening of the Holy Door at St Peter's Basilica on Tuesday 24th December 2024 and will run to the Solemnity of the Epiphany 2026. The magnitude of the Jubilee declared by Pope Francis requires that we inaugurate it locally in our parish as well. We are a parish full of hope and working together knowing that God is tenderly taking care of us. On the weekend of 18/19 January we shall officially inaugurate the Jubilee in our parish, the Mass will start from the Hall, and all of us process into the church through the main door.
