THEY WILL NOT BELIEVE IN HIM UNLESS THEY HEAR OF HIM

The Third Sunday of Ordinary time is dedicated to the proclamation of the Word of God. We would not be assembled here today if someone had not proclaimed the Word of God to us. We are a product of what was proclaimed to our forefathers and they passed it on to us their children. While they did their mission so well, we realise immediately that it is now in our hands. We have two choices to make: the first one is to take the proclamation of the Word of God upon ourselves and pass it on to others in its entirety or second we can keep it to ourselves and not communicate it to others.

In my ministry as a priest, I have come across people who claim to have faith, but that their faith is private. When someone does so, it neither do him/her good or do good to other people. Think of Wilbur and Orville Wright, the two brothers from Dayton, Ohio who in 1903 invented the aircraft, think of Benjamin Franklin who discovered electricity, or Computer scientists Vinton Cerf and Robert Kahn who invented the internet in 1983, what is common between these people among others, is that they communicated their findings to other people. If they had taken their knowledge and discoveries as their private possessions, our life today would be different and boring. This analogy applies to our responsibility as Christians to communicate the Word of God in word and in action.

The other point we need to realise is that not all of us will be endowed with the gift of preaching the Word, we are gifted in different ways, some people are better than others in some things than others. In such situation, it becomes a duty to support those who have the call to preach the Word of God. You can become a missionary without leaving your home; you can become a preacher without standing on the pulpit, or taking the microphone. The Religious Missionary Institute of the Apostles of Jesus, recruits and trains young men who feel called to go and preach the Gospel all over the world. In the Archdiocese of Birmingham, we are benefiting from their ministry in the person of our Parish Priest here and in the ministry of other priests in other Parishes in our Deanery including Chaplaincy at Walsgrave Hospital Coventry. You can contribute to the proclamation of the Word of God by sponsoring a young man in their seminaries to train for missionary priesthood. It costs the Institute £6000.00 (Six Thousand Pounds) to train One student per year in their seminaries. If you can do this, you will have contributed greatly to the proclamation and in every place.

St. Paul writing to the Romans and encouraging them to support the work of evangelisation wrote:

"Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved. But they will not ask his help, unless they believe in him, and they will not believe in him, unless they have heard of him, and they will not hear of him unless they get a preacher and they will never have a preacher unless one is sent" Rom 10:13-15.

Apostles of Jesus Missionaries Support UK is a Registered Charity No 1205905 for the purpose of supporting the training of missionary priests of Apostles of Jesus. As baptised we should take it as part of our baptismal package and mandate to proclaim the message of Jesus Christ until he comes again, thank you for supporting the work of evangelisation.
