Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord Year C

Readings: Is.60:1-6; Ps.72(71); Eph.3:2-3a,5-6; Mt. 2:1-12

The Epiphany Challenge!

From the dawn of creation God had been revealing himself by casting aside veil after veil and showing humanity truth after truth, until one day he unveiled his very face in his Son Jesus Christ. Isaiah foretold (Is 60:1-6) what would happen on that day. "Your light shall come," he said. Yes, it did come, and it is still shinning. Even on a day of deep and endless sorrows with darkness in its face, a true believer can feel Christ's light shooting through the marrow of his bones. "The riches of the sea shall be emptied out before you (Is 60:5), he said. Is it not true? Who among us came to Christ and did not experience the riches of God's love, a love that can build a heaven in hell's despair, a love that is unfathomed and deathless, flowing like heaven's life-stream full and sweet? "Your heart shall throb and overflow with joy" (Is 60:5), he said. Yes.

Every child brings down Something of heaven into the midst of our rough earthiness; but the child Jesus brought down heaven itself and that heaven is for all. That is why the Church of Christ is neither Latin nor Greek but Catholic. "In Christ Jesus the Gentiles are now co-heirs with the Jews, members of the same body and sharers of the promise" (Eph. 3:6). We celebrate this weekend the Feast of the Epiphany shortly after Christmas, because at Christmas Christ came into the world and at Epiphany, his coming is announced to all the world. It is in order to convey the image that the Church of Christ is universal, that all nations are at home in her, and that the arms of her crucified Lord are stretched above all races, God drew the Gentile Wise Men from the East to the crib where his Son was born. God excludes none from salvation, if they don't exclude themselves. Hence, we Christians have a mandate to reach out with Christ's saving mission to all people; missions are a must, not a maybe.

But our mission would not be effective if we ourselves have not really found Christ for ourselves – though we may call ourselves Christians. If we have found him as the Magi did, then we would daily offer Christ our gift of 'gold' to his royalty, namely our loyalty and fidelity to him; our gift of 'frankincense' to his divinity, namely our prayer and worship; and our gift of 'myrrh' to his humanity, namely our human sufferings and sorrows. On the other hand, if we have not yet found Christ, we should ask: why? Perhaps our faith is not deep enough to keep us searching for Christ in prayer, in the scriptures, in service and in joys and sorrows of this life. Perhaps we are distracted by the myriads of little stars such as money and power, comfort and security, offered by the world as the way to happiness. If so, our faith in eternal life with Christ has to be shaken.

Therefore, Epiphany offers us both a welcome and a challenge. It welcomes us to renew our faith and continue our search for fullness of Christ. It also challenges us to continue the manifestation of Christ to the world. It challenges us to share the light of Christ we have received with others who still grope their way from dark behind, because we believe that in Christ night is day; it challenges us to offer Christ to those who are still searching for the meaning in their lives, because we know that the Lord is the joy of every heart and his is the answer to its yearnings. It challenges us to become channels of God's grace, because grace that cannot be seen is no grace at all. The question is: are you going to accept this Challenge of Epiphany?
